ARMY RATION.—The following is the army ration, as amended by Congress, and approved August 23, 1861: Twenty-two ounces of bread or flour, or one pound of hard bread; three-fourths of a pound of pork or bacon, or one and one-fourth pounds of fresh or salt beef; fresh beef shall be issued as often as the commanding officer of any detachment or regiment shall require it, when practicable, in place of salt meat; and at the rate, to one hundred rations, of eight quarts of peas or beans, or in lieu thereof, ten pounds of rice; and one pound of potatoes per man shall be issued at least three times a week, if practicable; and when these articles cannot be issued in these proportions, an equivalent in value shall be issued in some other proper food, and a ration of tea may be substituted for a ration of coffee, upon the requisition of the proper officer; at the rate of one hundred rations, six pounds of coffee, twelve pounds of sugar, four quarts of vinegar; one and one-half pounds of tallow, or one and one-fourth pounds of lard, or one pound of sperm candles; four pounds of soap and two quarts of salt.
