

Meteorological Table. The following is an abstract from a meteorological table, observed at sunrise and at seven and one-half o'clock, p. m., at Mount Vernon Ranch, Jackson county, Oregon, by Nathaniel Meyer, Esq.:

In 1852 it rained 81 days; 47 successive days without rain; latest frost in Spring, May 14th; earliest frost in Autumn, October 19th; period without frost, 147 days.

In 1853 it rained 69 days; 68 successive days without rain; latest frost in Spring, May 15th; earliest frost in Autumn, October 10th; period without frost, 147 days.

In 1854 it rained 75 days; 53 successive days without rain; latest frost in Spring, May 30th; earliest frost in Autumn, October 31st; period without frost, 152 days.

In 1855 it rained 63 days; 60 successive days without rain; latest frost in Spring, May 29th; earliest frost in Autumn, October 17th; period without frost, 144 days.

In 1856 it rained 71 days; 53 successive days without rain; latest frost in Spring, May 17th; earliest frost in Autumn, October 31st; period without frost, 172 days.
