Death of the Noronians. The Rev. H. H. Leland, we learn that the above named man (more generally known in Jackson county as "Az, the dancing master,") has recently met a violent death. We come from the Independent.

It is very probable that Bullock was guilty of most of the crimes which he is reported to have committed, that of "killing a Deputy Sheriff in Jacksonville" being an exception, as there never has been such an officer named in the county. It will be remembered that about a year since a party of whites had a fight with Indians on Pitt river, at which time one Springer was captured, having in his possession a number of stolen horses. By a process of rather extreme strangulation, Springer was induced to confess that in company with Bullock, he had stolen the horses and set fire to Wabow Hinckley's house, in Logtown, in which himself and two daughters perished.

Quartz Lodes.—We learned, while at Catherine lately, that there were in that vicinity two good producing quartz lodes, that had been extensively prospected, and it is now fully expected that they will pay richly. One lode is on the north base of the Cotton mountains, and it is said that it will pay at least one hundred dollars per ton. One of the properties of the lode was two feet wide, in which the gold is ready to be seen with the naked eye. A large quantity of rock has been taken out, and it is said that everything made ready for crushing as soon as the water becomes sufficient to drive the machinery.

The other lode is on the south side of the Cotton mountains, on one of the tributaries of Cotton Creek, some three or four miles east of Hardyville. This lode is said to be very extensive, having been traced through the mountains some twelve miles. Quite a number of claims have been taken up, and a good deal of machinery is said to be on the road there. All of the parties interested are confident that they have a fortune. Who can calculate the amount of wealth hoarded up in our mountain fastnesses.

Captain John Mullan.—This gentleman passed through our city this week, on his way to Washington. He has been engaged for quite a number of years in the construction of a wagon road from Fort Benton, on the Missouri river, to Fort Walla Walla, on the Columbia. This road has been completed, and quite a large number of emigrants have passed over it this season. This promise of an excellent route. Captain Mullan goes to Washington to report in person, and to write out a full history of his labors in the Rocky Mountain.
