SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Legis. lative Assembly of the State of Oregon: That the terms of the Circuit Courts of the several Judicial Districts of this State shall be held annually, as follows:

in the First Judicial District, in the county of Josephine, on the second Monday in April and the fourth Monday in October; in the county of Jackson, on the second Mondays in February, June and November; in the county of Donglas, on the second Mondays in May and Octo-

In the Second Judicial District, in the county of Curry, on the first Monday in June; in the county of Coos, on the fourth Monday in May; in the county of Umpqua, on the third Monday in June; in the county of Lane, on the third Monday in April and on the fourth Monday in October; in the county of Benton, on the second Mondays in April and November.

In the Third Judicial District, in the county of Linn, on the fourth Mondays in March and October: in the county of Ma-rion, on the second Mondays in March and October; in the county of Polk, on the fourth Monday in April and third Monday in November; in the county of Yambil, on the second Mondays in April and No-
