U. S. Tax Notice.

THE UNITED STATES TAXES for the counties of JACKSON and JOSEPHINE having become due and payable, notice is hereby given that the Collector will be in attendance at
Jacksonville, Monday & Tuesday, Sept. 28 & 29.
Kirkville, Friday, Oct. 24, and at Waldo, Saturday, Oct. 31, 1863.

To receive the same and issue licenses.
Tax-payers will please notice the following extracts from the U. S. Excise Law.
"All persons who shall neglect to pay the duties and taxes, etc., as aforesaid, assessed upon them, to the Collector within the time specified, shall be liable to pay ten per centum additional on the amount thereof."
"Sec. 59.—And it is further enacted, That if any person or persons shall exercise or carry on any trade or business hereinafter mentioned, for the exercise or carrying on of which trade or business a license is required by this act, without taking out such license in that behalf required, he, she or they shall, for every such offense, respectively forfeit a penalty equal to three times the amount of the duty or sum of money imposed for such license, in addition thereof to the use of the United States, the other county to the use of the person who, if a collector, shall first discover, and if other than a collector, shall first give information of the fact whereby said forfeiture was incurred."
"No. 10.—The penalties prescribed by law, shall be rigidly enforced on all who fail to pay within the time specified in the above notice."
