A Repentant Rebel on Slavery.

An ex-slaveholder of Kentucky, named T. P. Atticus Bibb, writes to the Louisville Journal from Richmond (Va), under date of July 14th:

My poverty prevents me from returning to Kentucky, and, as I cannot therefore resource on the "stump" in that State all those political dogmas for which I was notorious wherever known, I beg to be allowed to do so through the columns of your valuable and widely disseminated journal. I feel that I ought to do so, and with the hope of doing good, both to the State and National Government, I propose to occupy a few squares in the columns of your paper.

St. Paul was cured of his Phariseism by being flogged to the earth and seeing a light from heaven. St. Peter could not understand that the new Covenant of Grace was intended for the Gentiles until God, in the vision of the white sheet, knit at the four corners, let down from heaven before him, full of all manner of four footed beasts, told him to stay and eat; that what God had "cleansed" was not "common or unclean." CURE FOR THE SMALL POX.—The following prescription is vouchered for by the Eastport, Maine, *Sentinel*, as a cure for the small-pox. It is worth trying:

"Give to the patient two tablespoonfuls of a mixture of hop yeast and water sweetened with molasses so as to be palatable; equal parts of each three times a day.
