There will be four days racing over the Jacksonville Race Course, in Jackson County, Oregon, commencing

Wednesday, Nov. 1st.

First Day's Races--Purse \$100

For two year-old horses, weighed in the scales--single dash of one mile--distance 10 miles, for each weight.

SAME DAY, Purse of \$100--distance half a mile--free for all.

Second Day--Purse, \$100.

For three and four-year-old horses, owned in Jackson County--single dash of one mile--each weight.

SAME DAY, Purse of \$100--distance half a mile--free for all.

Third Day--Purse \$125.

For all one-distance mile horse, two in three--weights according to the California rules.

FOURTH DAY--Purse, \$75.

For defeated horses--single dash of one mile--each weight.

SAME DAY, Purse of \$25--free for all California or Indian horses--single dash of one mile, entrance \$1.50.

Entrance ten per cent in all, the above races, three to enter and two to start to make a race.
