

EXCITEMENT IN CHINA.—The Kerbyville stage had an unusual load of passengers last Saturday. The most distinguished occupied choice seats. Neil, Sheriff Floyd, and the eminent Mr. Horton, together with some lesser celebrities, had the inside, and the handsome countenance of lawyer Jacobs smiled from the drivers seat. But the most noticeable among the passengers was a Chinaman, who was being sent to Salem at the request of the Circuit Court, to acquire the mysteries of brick making, under Major Berry. He was securely strapped along with the mail sack on the rack behind the coach, and when our Chinese population saw him their excitement was intense. Out from their doggeries and wash houses and hotels, they rashed in swarms; Colwell cracked his whip and sent his team on a run to the jail. Jacobs smiled a triumphant smile, Neil winked sagaciously, Floyd held his hat on, "John" "flopped" about on the rack like a limber eel in a trying-pan, and the crowd followed with most un-oriental haste. The stage arrived at the jail first, and when the breathless Chieftain came up, their countryman was safe beyond their wondering gaze. When they learned that he had been "sent up" for catching money belonging to a melican man they were perfectly satisfied and subsided immediately.

SHOCKING ACCIDENT.—On Thursday afternoon, Mrs. M. G. Booth, of this place, was so dreadfully burned by her clothes catching fire, while at work about the stove, that fears are entertained for her recovery. The unfortunate lady made an unsuccessful attempt to extinguish her burning garments, and becoming frantic, rushed, screaming, into her yard, and attracted the attention of some gentlemen standing at the Clerk's office, who ran to her relief and found the clothes nearly all burned off of her, and her injuries of the most terrible character. Her back was almost charred—all her person from her neck down shockingly burned; and the extent of her injuries may be realized when we state that two and a-half yards of oiled silk were insufficient to cover the burns. Her husband and only child were absent at the time, and their distress, on returning to find the wife and mother suffering the most intense agony, is almost beyond description. She was immediately attended by Drs. Greenman and Davis, and is receiving every possible care.

Poor Jim is unfortunate, having had his arm broken in the gymnasium while attending the University at Salem last year.

FREAK OF LIGHTNING.—During the late heavy thunder storm that passed over this valley, a telegraph pole, south of "Tolman's," was struck and slightly splintered; three oak trees to which the line was attached were missed, and the two next poles were also struck. It seems strange that the green trees, being better conductors than the dry wood, should be missed, and the dry poles selected for the passage of the fluid.

NEW PAPER.—A paper, to be called the *Reveille*, is to be issued from the office of the *defunct Press* next week. It is rumored that N. D. Short, brother-in-law of Sheriff Owen, and just from Platte city, (Kansas) is to be the editor. It will probably be democratic.

HEAVY STORM.—During the week a heavy rain storm has visited this part of the State, and as far as we can learn, extended north to Portland. In Scott Valley, (Cal.) the wind blew with tremendous violence, and swept down the whole of the telegraph line, cutting off our communication with San Francisco for several days.

SOME SQUASH.—We saw this week at Muller & Brentano's, a squash which weighed 91 pounds. It was about two feet and a-half long, and about fourteen inches in diameter. This huge vegetable was raised on the farm of Mr. Pennell on Applegate.

FRUIT.—Thousands of bushels of choice apples are rotting on the ground in this valley. Farmers are glad to get one cent per pound for it. We should think that the manufacture of vinegar from it, would be more profitable.

ALL FILLED.—Our population is certainly increasing. Notwithstanding the number of new houses built during the last year, there is not a single house vacant in town, and almost daily, parties apply in search of houses to rent.

SPEED THE PLOUGH.—The late rains have moistened the ground so that our farmers are busy turning it up for the fall seeding. It is thought that a large amount of grain will be sown the present season.

TO SALEM.—Mr. Thos. Floyd, of Josephine Co., and his deputy, passed through town on their way to Salem, Sunday last, with two prisoners who had been sentenced to the State Penitentiary.

HORTON "the jail bird," plead guilty to an indictment found by a Grand Jury in Josephine county, charging him with stealing a horse, and was sentenced to States Prison for three years.
