Resolved, That any Senator of the United States elected by the votes of the Union Republicans, who at this time blenches and betrays is infamous and should be dishonored and execrated while the free government exists.

Resolved, That the faithful Senators of the United States who have to this time urged the conviction of Andrew Johnson, are entitled to honor and gratitude and are earnestly requested to be faithful to the end, and by every legitimate and honorable means to secure the removal of the acting President which his crimes deserve, which the people demand and which is necessary for the honor, the freedom and the prosperity of the country.

Resolved, That the vote upon the Articles of Impeachment preferred against Andrew Jonnson should not be taken, unless conviction is certain, until by prompt action Arkansas, Louisiana, North Carolina, South Carolina and Florida, are represented in the Senate, and that the Republicans in Congress are earnestly urged to take immediate action in this matter.
