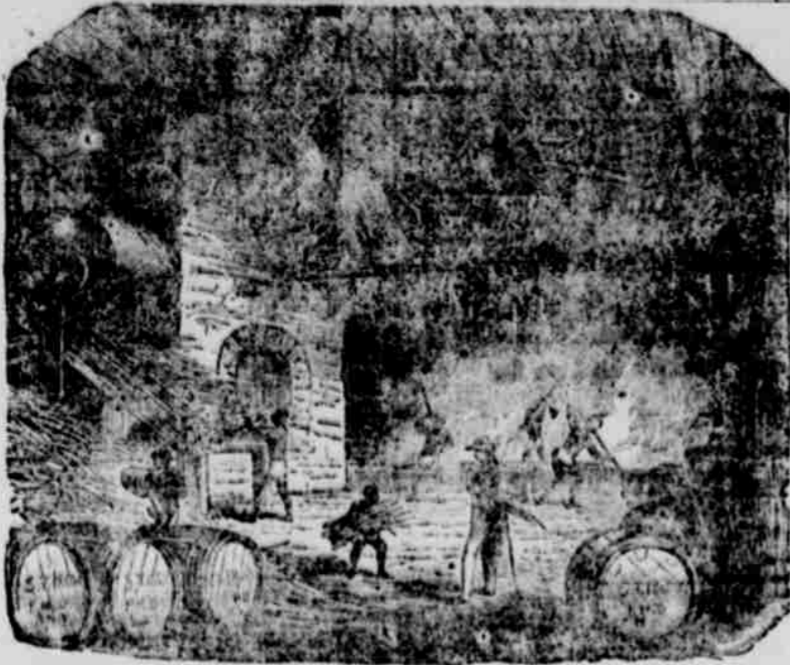
THE WEATHER.—We have been blessed with several fine showers this week, but cold dry winds have been prevalent. We need much more rain to insure good crops.
