Run-away.—As Dr. Overbeck was returning from Union Town, last Saturday night, from a professional visit, in company with James Stewart, his buggy ran into a rut at the side of the road, throwing him out on his head, and jerking the lines out of his hands.

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Owens and Shipley.—Alfred Owens filed a complaint, last week, against T. H. B. Shipley, Superintendent of Common Schools, before James R. Wade, J. P., charging Mr. Shipley with making two assaults on him with a dangerous weapon, on the 1st of November, 1889.

Justice Wade, on Thursday last, adjourned the case of the State vs. Thomas G. Owens for an assault with a dangerous weapon on George S. Jackson, in September last, and bound him over for his appearance in the Circuit Court in the sum of one hundred dollars.

Smash-up.—Last Sunday, as James Carlwell, of this place, was driving along the street in front of the Court House, his horse shied and ran one of the buggy hubs against the Court House fence, breaking the buggy badly, and throwing driver, fragments of the vehicle, reins, &c., all together in a heap on the ground.

Drowned.—On the 29th of last month a boy eight years of age, by the name of Triplet, is supposed to have been drowned in Rogue River, at what is known as Cooper's Ford, some five miles above Bybee's ferry.

Fire.—A fire broke out in the wash-house belonging to the Franco American Hotel, at this place, on the 29th inst., which, but for its prompt extinguishment might have proved quite serious. It caught from a slip in a stove pipe.
