On the criminal docket, in the case of the State vs. Brown, indicted for an assault with intent to kill Adney, the jury found a verdict of "Guilty," and he was sentenced by Judge Prim for three years in the Penitentiary.

The case of the State vs. Thomas G. Owen, Deputy Sheriff, for an assault with a dangerous weapon, was continued on the affidavit of the defendant, till the next February term of Court. The ground of the continuance was the statement in the affidavit of the absence of two material witnesses for the defendant—Miss Nida and Mat Ish.

On the civil docket there was only one jury case—Drury vs. Lacy. Suit by the plaintiff for necessities furnished the defendant's wife during their separation. Verdict against plaintiff.

Two divorces for cruel treatment were granted—Wade vs. Wade and McVay vs. McVay.

Several others continued till next term of Court.
