CIRCUIT COURT .-- Circuit Court adjourned, yesterday morning, until 9 o'clock on next Monday morning. In the case of the State of Oregon against W. Nuss and Chas. Sohneider, the defendants demanded separate trials, and the jury empaneled to try the case of Nuss who was put upon trial first, having returned a verdict of "not guilty," the Prosecuting Attorney on behalf of the State moved the court to dismiss the prosecution against Schnei-

der on the ground that the evidence in both cases was the same and in his mind insufficient to secure a conviction. The court granted the motion, and the prosecution was accordingly dismissed. This was an indictment for "malicious and wanton killing of animals," hogs belonging to James Hamlin. In the case of the State of Oregon against Pe ter Schmidlin indictment for an assault with a dangerous weapon, on "Jo" Davis, sometime in the early part of May last, the jury found a verdict of "guilty" as charged in the indictment and the defendant was accordingly fined \$100 and the costs of the prosecution. On the civil docket, in the case of A. B. Overbeck vs . Thos. Pyle, judgment was rendered for the plantiff for the sum of \$517,50 and his costs. P. J. Ryan also recovered a judgment for \$182,75 and costs against Brown and Fuller. There were three divorce cases Mary 152 Brown vs. James Brown, divorce grant-

ed. Thos. Brown vs. Florence Brown, continued. A. T. Johnson vs. Elizabath Johnson continued. Judge Steele of Yreka, was present during the term on professional business. The consideration of the referees' report in the case of Pat. McMannus vs. W. A. Owen & John Pawpaw was deferred until next Monday. Two applications for citizenship were granted : Heinrich Christian Wintjen and W. J. McMuran.


Celebration Meeting at Ashland.




