Religious Notices.

Rev. C. ALDERSON will preach at the M. E. church, to-morrow morning, at 11 o'clock.

FATHER BLANCHET will hold divine services at the Catholic church to-morrow at the usual hour.

FUNERAL SERVICE.—The funeral sermon of Hon. Jackson Rader will be preached by Rev. B. R. Johnson, at Simpson's School House, near Butte Creek, on Sunday, Dec. 4th, at 11 o'clock, A. M. Friends of the family are invited to attend.

CIRCUIT COURT.—The Circuit Court for Jackson county adjourned its November term on the 1st day of this month, after a session of over 2 weeks. It was the longest term of Court that has been held here for several years. The result of the jury cases we have already published. In the case of R. H. Moore against Thomas F. Floyd and his securities a motion for a new trial was made by defendants, and overruled by the Court. In the case of Della Slepens vs. J. W. Hays, garnishee, tried by the Court, plaintiff recovered a judgment of \$45 and some cents against the defendant Hays. In the suit of Chambers vs. Chambers, for a partition of real property, the Court made an order reserving it for further consideration. The questions, in this case, were raised on plaintiff's demurrer to defendant's answer. In the case of Alfred Prieter vs. M. H. Drake, an issue was made up and until the next term of Court allowed for taking evidence. In the case of Holman Peters vs. Jos. Williams—suit to foreclose a mortgage—the demurrer to defendant's answer was overruled and until next term of Court allowed for filing a replication. The Court then adjourned.

THE TAYLOR FAMILY.—Mort Taylor, who we believe constitutes the "Taylor Family," performed here last night and night before last. Owing to accident, no notice was given through this paper, and the advent of the troupe was unknown outside of town. Considering this imperfect notice, the attendance was good. Mr. Taylor's singing and juggling were excellent. His songs were all comic, and his local rhymes were pointed and popular with his audience. He is a master in his profession, and if true is worth money, there is no place where one can get more for the price, than at one of Mort Taylor's performances. The music was excellent as well as the singing. Prof. Barney executed a piece in splendid style, on one string of a violin. The whole performance on both evenings was a success, and we recommend the troupe to public favor, during their tour through Oregon which they have just begun.

RAILROAD SURVEY.—The Yreka Journal says: "The Hood party is down the mountain as far as Cole's, and will soon reach the Klamath River on the new line. The new survey will no doubt extend down Cottonwood Creek, but how it will run towards Yreka, cannot be surmised at present. The route straight to town, from the mouth of Shasta River, on the Klamath, is considered very rough, but if the distance is shorter than along the stage road, it will still have an advantage of some consideration in the location of the established route."

SOLD OUT.—We learn from the Yreka Journal that Mr. Jesse D. Carr has sold out the California and Oregon stage line to the new mail contractors, Messrs. Barlow & Co., and that they will take possession to-morrow.
