UNITED STATES LAND SURVEY.—The surveying party of Messrs. Turner and Howard, U. S. Deputy Surveyors, under the superintendence of Mr. Howard, started for the Lake country, last Thursday morning, with ample supplies for a three months trip. Mr. Turner, being unwell, has not yet started, but expects to get off in a few days. They have received the contract for surveying Langell, Swan Lake, and Barnes valleys, and the country adjacent to Alkali Lake, comprising nearly seven townships. We are glad that Surveyor General Odell has given our townsmen this contract, as they are both competent and deserving, and as that country is fast settling up, it is right that it should be surveyed as soon as possible.

BOLD ROBBERY.—Last Tuesday night the house of Mr. Wm. Bybee, near this city, was entered by some unknown person, Mr. B.'s pantaloons taken from under his pillow, and about \$83 taken therefrom. He did not discover the theft until morning, when he missed his pantaloons, which, upon search being made, were found in the kitchen.

SORREL.—The Sorrel given by the Jacksonville Band, for the benefit of the Red Knights, last Wednesday, passed off very pleasantly.

HAIL STORM.—A severe rain and hail storm visited this county last Sunday. About four miles from town, on the Sterling road, the hail fell so thick and laid on the ground so long, without melting, as to cause the country to assume a wintry aspect, and the contrast between the white ground and the vivid green of a waving cornfield, on the farm of Mr. Crump, was startling and a sight not often seen. The weather had been cool and cloudy for some time.

QUICK TIME.—We are informed by Father Blanchet, of this city, who arrived, yesterday morning, from Portland, that he made the trip in 42 hours. This is, we believe, the best time ever made, and the stage company deserve much credit for the speed and promptness of their traveling facilities.
