Our Christmas Tree.

On Christmas night, at half past six o'clock, every foot of sitting and standing space in the Court House was occupied, while others still, were clamoring for admittance. After the opening anthem by the Choir, the curtains were drawn and the effect was striking. The tree was lit by a hundred tapers, beautifully decorated and hung with fruits and handsome ornaments. A genuine "Old Santa Claus" advanced, and after a brief address, proceeded to distribute his gifts to the eager young folks. Several prominent citizens received presents more appropriate than valuable, which created considerable merriment. The Choir, under direction of Prof. E. C. Brooks, entertained the assemblage, at intervals, with excellent music. The President, Judge Prim, maintained admirable order, and the Festival, throughout, was a most pleasurable occasion, and will so be long remembered.

The committee appointed to raise money for purchasing gifts, succeeded in collecting some \$257. The heading of that subscription list stated that the money subscribed would be expended for the benefit of the poor. We watched the distribution of gifts closely and observed that the poor children, generally, went away laden with substantial presents—clothing, &c. In addition to the gifts of the committee, there were distributed several hundred dollars worth of gifts, presented by husbands, wives, friends, &c. There were present some children who did not receive gifts; on which account much murmuring is heard. Now the children who received no gifts were the children of rich or well-to-do parents. Did any one suppose that the committee would collect money for the poor and then distribute it among the rich? Such was clearly not the understanding. Everybody had a right to place a present on that tree who so desired; therefore the blame of all disappointments rests with parents and not with the committee. We believe that the committee, both ladies and gentlemen, and all concerned in getting up the festival, used their faithful and best efforts to accomplish a praiseworthy object, and were successful; and furthermore, we consider them entitled to a vote of thanks from this community.
