for a patent for such vein or lode, and the same may be patented therewith, subject to the same preliminary requirements as to survey and notice as are applicable under this act to veins or lodes: provided, That no location hereafter made of non-adjacent land shall exceed five acres, and payment for the same must be made at the same rate fixed by this act for the superficies of the lode. The owner of a quartz mill or reduction works, not owning a mine in connection therewith, may also receive a patent for his millsite, as provided in this section.

Sec. 16. That all acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed: provided, That nothing contained in this act shall be construed to impair, in any way, rights or interests in mining property acquired under existing laws.
