A single American might compete with a single mongol or with any other human being but it is false to say that any head of a family can support wife and children on the pittance that a royal pay to an Asiatic locust. The question at the East is viewed as one between labor and capital, and our workmen may have to adjust it by the law of might which will insure the survival of the caucasian.
