1. Seberihers who do not give express, notice to be contrary, are considered as wishing to continue a sir subscriptions.

2. If any subscribers order the discontinuance of their newspapers, the publisher may continue to send them until all arrearages are paid.

3. It subscribers neglect or refuse to take their newspapers from the offices to which they are directed, the law holds them responsible until they have actiled the bills, and ordered them discontinued.

4. If subscribers remove to other places without farming the publisher, and the newspapers are send e the former direction, they are held responsible.

5. The Courts have decided that refusing to take newspapers from this office, or removing and leaving them uncalled for, is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud.

6. The postmaster who neglects to give legal notes of the neglect of a person to take from the office he newspaper dressed to him, is liable to the pulsable for the subscription price.


