"BELLE DRUNK AND NO DINNER."

Detroit, Michigan, January 4th.—To-day a divorce case brought by August Miersch against his wife was on for a hearing. It was found to have a ludicrous side from the peculiar nature of the evidence presented. August and Isabel were married at Salem, Mass., in 1872, and came to Detroit in 1874. During the first three years of her married life Belle kept pretty straight, but in 1875 Belle began to have a taste for ardent spirits, and frequently came home drunk. August claims that she stole money from him to buy liquor, and had a way of gadding around with other men. The funny part of the whole business is, that August kept a daily record of Belle's condition for nearly two years, and this record was sworn to entire, and pasted into the testimony. May 5—Twice drunk.
May 11—Drunk the whole day.
May 14—Drunk.
May 15—Drunk; no dinner or supper.
May 20—Belle drunk; stole 34 cents.
May 22—Had a man in the house who left his satchel on the table and ran out of the back door when he saw me; found the whisky bottle.

Protest From Montana.

HELANA (M. T.), February 6.—The Board of Trade have unanimously adopted a resolution protesting against the passage by Congress of the bill withdrawing from pre-emption and homestead entry public lands lying West of the 100th meridian, and declaring that the report of the Committee, which assumes that all land lying West of that meridian is not tillable, is untrue as far as it concerns Montana, which has fifteen million acres of the most productive lands in America, declaring that the change in the laws, which puts lands into the hands of non-resident speculators, is a pernicious one and will shut off immigration from this, which will otherwise be one of the greatest States in the Union. —S.
