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3. If subscribers neglect or refuse to take their newspapers from the office to which they are directed, the publisher holds them responsible until they are notified the same, and ordered them discontinued.

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5. The Courts have decided that refusing to take newspapers from this office, or removing and leaving them uncollected, is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud.

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FISH CULTURE.

The various streams of Oregon abound with trout and fish of fine flavor and size. The mountain trout is considered a great delicacy and brings fancy prices whenever they reach this market, which is very seldom. The red fish of the Willamette Lake are said to be superior to any trout ever captured, but they are too far distant to reach market. The mountain trout are very scarce in our valley streams on account of having been constantly

will be found except in the mountain streams far back from the valley or in hatchery ponds. Capt. J. C. Ainsworth and Capt. John Harlow have taken a great interest in fish culture. The former has a hatchery establishment near Kalama on a cool mountain stream. The eggs are hatched and the fry taken on Gravelly Lake, at his Summer residence near Tacoma, where they are set free and properly tended. Capt. Harlow has a fish stream about 15 miles back of East Portland and on the Banks of the Columbia, being one of the most romantic spots of the State.

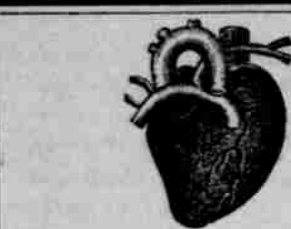
When the ponds are completed and stocked it will be a famous resort for the captain and his friends. A few months ago Capt. J. C. Ainsworth sent an order to Seth Green, the celebrated pisciculturist, for 20,000 red speckled trout eggs. They were packed in a damp mass, as usual, and sent away on their long journey across the continent. Unfortunately they encountered very cold weather and were frozen, which destroyed them. Of this shipment Capt. Harlow was to receive 2,000 eggs, with which he intended to stock one of his ponds, but both gentlemen were doomed to disappointment. The surest way to secure a stock of these trout is to order the fry direct from Mr. Green, and if sent by express, will receive the care of expressmen along the route.

WHAT SMOKING DOES FOR BOYS—A certain doctor, struck with the large number of boys under 15 years of age he observed smoking, was led to inquire into the effect the habit had upon the general health. He took for his purpose 38 aged from 9 to 15, and carefully examined them. In 27 he discovered injurious traces of the habit. In 22 there were various disorders of the circulation and digestion, palpitation of the heart, and more or less taste for strong drink. In 12 there were frequent bleedings of the nose, 10 had disturbed sleep, and 12 had slight ulceration of the mucous membrane of the mouth, which disappeared on ceasing the use of tobacco for some days. The doctor treated them all for weakness, but with little effect until smoking was discontinued, when health and strength were soon restored. Now this is no "old wife's tale," as these facts are given under authority of the "British Medical Monthly."

Earnestly true as the above is, it contains no warning for the boy who set it up in our office complacently lit a cigarette as the item was furnished and remarked: "I'm past 16, and I guess it won't hurt me; but sooner or later the youth will see his mistake."
