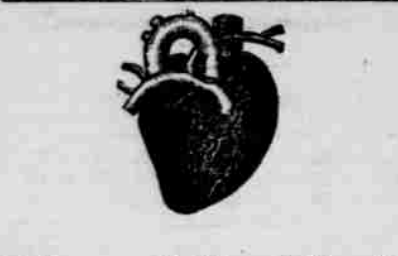

SUMMONS.

Augusta Sisson, plaintiff vs. A. D. Helman and his wife Mary Jane Helman.

In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for the County of Jackson.

Suit in Equity to establish lost contract, lost map to enforce a contract for real estate and to quiet the title to the same.

B. Hargadine, be compelled to pay the same to the plaintiff.

That the defendants pay the costs, expenses and disbursements of this suit, and for such other and further relief as equity and good conscience may require.
