GARFIELD'S ACCEPTANCE. An Able Review of the Issues of the Campaign.

MENTOR, (O.), July 12.—Gen. Garfield has forwarded to Senator Hoar of Massachusetts the following letter of acceptance of the nomination tendered him by the Republican National Convention: MENTOR, (O.), July 10, 1880.

GREAT NATIONAL ISSUES. Without reviewing the controversies which have been settled during the last twenty years, and with no purpose or wish to revive the passions of the late war, it should be said that while Republicans fully recognize and will strenuously defend all the rights retained by the people...

RIGHT OF SUFFRAGE IN THE SOUTH. Such efforts will sooner restore to perfect peace those who were lately in arms against each other, for justice and good will will outlast passion; but it is certain that a complete recovery from the wounds of the war cannot fully pervade the whole country until every citizen, rich or poor, white or black, is secure in the free and equal enjoyment of every civil and political right guaranteed by the Constitution and the laws.

PROTECTION TO MANUFACTURES. In reference to our custom laws a policy should be pursued which will bring a revenue to the Treasury, and will enable the labor and capital employed in our great industries to compete fairly in our own markets with the labor and capital of foreign producers.

CHECKS TO CHINESE IMMIGRATION. The material interests of this country, the traditions of its settlement and the sentiments of our people have led the Government to offer the widest hospitality to emigrants who seek our shores for new and happy homes, willing to share the burdens as well as the benefits of our society...

afford should be generously given to aid the States in supporting common schools; but it would be unjust to our people and dangerous to our institutions to apply any portion of the revenues of the nation or of the States to the support of sectarian schools.

THE DIPLOMATIC SERVICE. The appointment of citizens to the various executive and judicial offices of the Government is perhaps the least difficult of all the duties which the Constitution has imposed upon the Executive. The Constitution wisely demands that Congress shall cooperate with the executive departments in placing the civil service on a better basis.

PERSONAL CONVICTIONS. The doctrines announced are not the levices of a party to attract votes and carry an election. They are deliberate convictions, resulting from careful study of the spirit of our institutions, the events of our history and the best interests of our people.
