### Law of Newspapers.

Subscribers who do not give express notice to be centrary, are considered as wishing to continue a sir subscriptions.

1. If any subscribers order the discontinuance of more newspapers, the publisher may continue to send them until all arrearages are paid.

2. If subscribers neglector refuse to take their newspapers from the offices to which they are diacted, the law holds them responsible until they are settled the bills, and ordered them discontinued.

4. If subscribers remove to other places without norming the publisher, and the newspapers are sent of the former direction, they are held responsible.

5. The Courts have decided that refuding to take a ewspapers from this office, or removing and leaving them uncalled for, is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud.

6. The postmaster who neglects to give legal newspapers

The postmaster who neglects to give legal ne-tice of the neglect of a person to take from the office are newspaper addressed to him, is liable to the pub-sher for the subscription price.
