A CHINESE IMMIGRATION BILL.

Senator Miller has prepared a bill upon the subject of Chinese immigration which is in fourteen sections, says the Sacramento "Bee," and which, in brief, is as follows:

Section 1.—The entry of Chinese into the United States—with the exception of students, merchants or traders engaged in lawful commerce, or officers of the Chinese Government—is prohibited, except such as were residents on the 19th of July, 1881.

Section 2.—Any Chinaman residing in this Nation on that date can only re-enter on condition of having before his departure been duly registered at some Consular house in the United States.

Section 3.—Provides for the keeping of registry books.

Section 4.—No Chinese of any class or occupation whatever, except such as resided in the United States on the 19th day of July, 1881, shall be allowed to enter the jurisdiction of the United States without the consent of the Chinese Government first specially in each case.

Section 5.—Provides for the issuance of a certificate of every registered Chinaman.

Section 6.—Any person found guilty of perjury or forgery in connection with such registration shall be fined in a sum not to exceed \$1,000 and be imprisoned not less than two nor more than ten years.

Section 7.—Provides penalties for masters of vessels bringing such Chinese to the United States as are prohibited by this bill.

Section 8.—The master of any vessel before permitting any Chinese passengers to land must deliver to the Collector of Customs a list of such passengers, together with the necessary facts.
