THE PLATFORM.

The following is the report of the committee on resolutions at the State convention, which form the platform of the Republican party in the State: The Republican party of Oregon in convention assembled do make and

affirm the following declaration of our political principles: RESOLVED-First, That we favor honest, efficient and economic adminis-

tration of every department of govern-Second, That we favor the equal protection of the rights of labor and

oamital. Third, We are in favor of regulating the salaries of county officers so that they shall receive such compensations as are commensurate with their

Fourth, That we regard the free school system of our State as the special care and pride of the Republican party. Fifth, That it is the policy of the Republican party to foster and en-courage the development of our State by the construction of railways which will place us in direct communication with our sister states.

Sixth, That we hold all corporations to be strictly responsible to their liabilities under the law, and recognize the right of the legislature to enact all reasonable limitations on corporate powers.

Seventh, That to the end that all settlers upon all unearned railroad lands in this State may be enabled to obtain titles without delay, and that those seeking homes may not be embarrassed in the location of lands, we favor such action by congress as will place such lands within reach of actual settlers at a price not exceeding, \$2 50 per acre, under such conditions and ovisions as will secure the railway companies in any vested rights or equities that may they have in the proceeds of such lands.

Ninth, That the rapidly increasing manufacturing and wool raising inter ests of the State demand the continued fostering care of the general government.

Tenth, That the reciprocity treaty with the Sandwich islands is an imposition upon the government and the people, and should be speedily abrogat out delay, as we must have

Eleventh, That by the generous policy of the Republican party in congress, liberal appropriations have been made to various portions of the State. and we favor a continuance of this liberal policy for the development of our State and especially for the improvement of the Columbia river and its tributaries, the Yaquina and Coos bays, and proposed harbor of refuge at Port Orford, the Umpqua, Coquille and Siuslaw rivers, the construction of the locks at the Cascades and the Dalles of the Columbia river, as well as other sections of our State.

Twelfth, We prefoundly deplore the untimely and tragic death of James Abram Garfield, late President of the United States, whowas shot down while in the discharge of his official duties by the hand of a cowardly assassin, and we approve and appland the practical wisdom, the unselfish patriotism and the unswerving fidelity to the constitu tion and the principles of American liberty with which James A. Garfield discharged under circumstances of unparalleled difficulties the duties and re sponsibilities of the Presidential office during his brief occupancy there.

Thirteenth, We regard President Arthur's veto of the bill for restriction of Chinese immigration as unwise and unjust, and we condemn the policy which prompted it as being opposed to the principles of the Republican party as expressed in the platform of our last National Republican Convention; and

We heartily commend our representative in congress, Hon. M. C. George, for his able efforts to secure the passage of such bill; and

We here carnestly declare it to be our belief that Chinese immigration to the United States should be restricted, and we demand that our representatives in congress shall persist in advoeating the enactments of a law that will effectually accomplish this result.

Fourteenth, That we heartily endorse the course of our able congressman, Hon. M. C. George, in his untiring efforts in behalf of our State; and that we heartily approve the economi cal and efficient administration on the part of our present Republican State officers.






