News Gleanings.

"Eren a King can be a nuisance." Yes, indeed. Many's the time we've wished the king was an ace. Guiteau has selected as his spiritual guide Rev. W. W. Hicks, Presbyterian minister of Washington, who will make daily calls at the jail.

The Supreme court has affirmed the judgment of the state circuit court for Multnomah county in the case of John C. Powers, sentenced to death for the murder of Ben Cornelius July 4th, 1881.

Mr. Habersham's surveying party is very busily engaged on the re location of the road and tunnel in the mountain between Cow and Wolf creeks. The company has adopted the lower or long tunnel route.

Gen Caldwell informs the Red Bluff "Sentinel" that a force of men have been sent to the north of Redding to commence the construction of culverts on the main line to Oregon, work upon which will soon be in active progress.

"What kind of little boys go to heaven?" A lively four-year old boy with kicking boots flourished his fist. "Well, you may answer," said the teacher. "Dead ones," the little fellow shouted to the full extent of his lungs.—[Springfield Republican.

The senate committee on postoffices and post roads has been considering the propriety and advisability of reducing postage on letters to two cents. On newspapers and other printed matter to one-half the present rates, and asks the postmaster general if proposed rates can be adopted with safety.

In regard to the Northern Pacific Railroad Company, the committee that has been studying the matter has arrived at the conclusion that, under the law granting the land the latter cannot be forfeited to the Government to be returned to the public domain. The Government can only take such steps as it deems best to procure the completion of the road.

The Grand Lodge, A. F. & A. M., of Oregon, was in session in Portland last week; the following officers have been elected: M. W. G. M., J. N. Dolph; D. W. G. M., Wright of Union; S. G. W., J. C. Fullerton, of Roseburg; G. T., Jacob Mayer; G. S., F. G. Babcock, of Salem. A large amount of routine business was done and the session closed on Thursday.

The President has nominated as members of the tariff commission: Wm. A. Wheeler, of New York, chairman; John L. Hayes, of Massachusetts; Henry W. Oliver, jr., of Pennsylvania; Austin M. Garland, of Illinois; Jacob Amber, of Ohio; John S. Phelps, of Missouri; Robert F. Barton, of District of Columbia; John W. H. Underwood, of Georgia; and Duncan F. Kenner, of Louisiana.

New York, June 12.—"Herald's" Fort Keogh, Montana special: Among the good results of Villard's visit to the west is an order that hereafter there shall be sold to no person more than 160 acres of Northern Pacific lands. For months past the west, and especially the Yellowstone valley, has been swarmed with eastern speculators buying up large tracts of land, to be held for a rise. Villard's order completely checkmates speculators.

Some attention is about to be paid to Alaska. A resolution has been offered in the senate to authorize the President to declare martial law in portions of this territory. There is no protection for life and property in south-eastern Alaska, and an effort is to be made to bring about a better order of things. It is proposed that an officer of the army or navy shall be appointed to act as military governor, who may use the land or naval forces to preserve order.

Recently an iron express car was put on the Southern Pacific road. The car is very strong and is bullet proof, an important item in the Arizona county. It is made in two compartments, and the other, for four or five expressmen and guards. There are doors only on the sides, and loop holes in the side of the car give the expressmen, who are fully armed, a beautiful opportunity to pick off train robbers. In addition to the force of men, arms and ammunition, there were four Siberian blood hounds in the car. The hounds cost \$250 each. The same style of car will go with each train.
