

Walbridge, Fort Klamath vice J. S. McCain. Col W. S. Stone and Dr. W. H. King; timer, L Swan. The following noted horses were named for this race: Geo. Stephenson named s. g. Professor Jay Beach named b. s. Altamont; and Jas. Sutherland named b. m. Nellie, all fast and well bred animals. On the night preceeding race, the horses sold in pools at \$20 each on Nellie and Al tamont, and \$3.50 on Professor. On day of race Nellie became the favorite. ord. and sold for \$10 to \$5 on Altamont and \$2 50 for Professor. The horses were driven respectively by the parties who named them for the race. 
