

THANKSGIVING PROCLAMATION.

STATE OF OREGON EXECUTIVE OFFICE, SALEM, Nov. 8, 1882. In accordance with a custom long established and in pursuance of a recommendation of Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States, I recommend that Thursday, the 30th day of November, A. D. 1882, be observed by all the people of this commonwealth as a day of public thanksgiving and prayer to the Supreme Ruler of the universe, who has vouchsafed to us blessings innumerable during the year just past. He has granted abundant harvests to the husbandman, prosperity to our commercial interests and general health to all of our people. For these and other blessings which have been our portion, I would recommend that upon the day named all secular business be dispensed with and that our people assemble at their houses of worship and in true sympathy with the purposes of this proclamation give unto God thanksgiving and praise for his many mercies. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the great seal of State to be affixed thereto. Done at the capitol at Salem this 8th day of November, A. D. 1882. Z. F. Moody, Governor.
