

THE IOWA AMENDMENT.

The annual session of the national Grange, Patrons of Husbandry, was held at Indianapolis last week. Representatives from thirty-two states were in attendance. Reports from the various officers showed the order to be in flourishing condition, and, despite the decline in some states, to be gradually on the increase throughout the Union.

Since the Chinese restriction law went into effect, three months ago, 3849 Chinese have left this country and only 169 have arrived from China and Japan. During the last month the arrivals were only 72 while in October of last year 972 arrived, a difference of 900. Notwithstanding the Democratic magnifying of a few weak points which the law possesses it seems to be accomplishing great deal of practical good.
