

**THE HOUSEHOLD.**

A true test for eggs is to drop them in water, and if the large end comes up they are not fresh.

A recipe for chapped hands is a piece of camphor the size of a walnut melted with a cupful of tallow.

Bar soap, when first bought, should be cut in pieces and put in a dry place. It lasts better after shrinking.

When boiling cabbage put a slice of salt pork in the water, and an agreeable flavor with no objectionable grease or fat will be given to the cabbage.

A simple but delicious dish for dessert is made by cutting up oranges in small pieces and then pouring over them some rich boiled custard. Serve with cake.

To boil ducks, choose a fine fat one salt it for two days, then boil it slowly in a cloth. Serve it with onion sauce using milk instead of water in its preparation.

If before you put rolls in the tin to bake them, you rub the edges with a little melted butter, they will not be troubled by their sticking together when baked, and they will be smooth.

To make mint sauce mix one tablespoonful of white sugar to half a tea-

**LAND OFFICE CIRCULAR.**

INSTRUCTIONS TO REGISTRARS AND RECEIVERS REGARDING RELINQUISHMENTS.

Registers and receivers, U. S. land offices.—GENTLEMEN: The following instructions are communicated for your information and guidance. You will be strictly governed thereby and will exercise the greatest vigilance and employ the most decisive action in carrying the same into effect:

"Whenever relinquishments of pre-emption, homestead, or timber culture filings or entries are presented at your office within such time after entry, or under such circumstances in respect to actual or presumptive date of the execution of such relinquishments, or in respect to the sale or traffic therein, or otherwise, as to afford reasonable ground to believe that the filing or entry was fraudulently made for speculation and not in good faith as required by law, you will withhold your relinquishments and report the facts to this office."

June 1, 1882. Registrars and receivers are cautioned to make oath that their filings and entries are made for the cultivation of timber and for his own use.
