

**The Settlement Law.**  
Washington, May 17.—A report has been submitted to accompany the bill reported from the House Committee on Public Lands, providing for the repeal of the pre-emption and culture, and amendments to the homestead law. The committee says: "We believe it should be the policy of the Government to give those of our citizens who are without homes such an amount of its public domain as will make them comfortable homesteads where they enter it in good faith, intending to make it their home, and to cultivate and live on the same for a fixed period of time, and we believe 160 acres should be the maximum. Under the pre-emption, homestead and timber culture laws, as they now stand, one person may become owner of 480 acres of the public domain, 160 acres under each law. This is too large an amount of land, in our opinion, for any person to acquire in this manner. We think the policy of the government should be to furnish as many citizens with comfortable homes as long in the future as is possible, and 160 acres is enough for this purpose. By giving this amount it will not be many years till our public domain will be taken up. The pre-emption law was passed in '61, the homestead law in '67, and the timber culture in '73. When the homestead act was enacted the pre-emption law should have been repealed, and the timber culture law should never have been passed. We have, therefore, in substitute, provided for the repeal of the pre-emption and timber culture acts, and offer an amendment to the homestead law."

Washington, May 19.—The bill in relation to the forfeiture of the Northern Pacific lands which was introduced to-day by Senator Dolph, provides for the immediate restoration of the public domain and co-operation of the public land laws with its main line between Wallula Junction and Portland, a distance of 214 miles. It also provides for the forfeiture at the end of the five years from the passage of the bill all lands adjacent to that portion of the Cascade grant which shall be unbuilt in effect, giving the road five years to build the Cascade branch. The bill proposes to authorize persons in possession of any of these lands to purchase 320 acres if so much has been improved by them. The railroad company is required to file its assent to the conditions of the bill so as to avoid all question as to the title of the forfeited land.

**Republican Platform.**

7. That all unearned grants to railroads and wagon roads in this state should be forfeited and opened to settlement by those entitled to the benefit of the land laws of the United States.  
8. That the laws of Oregon providing for assessment and collecting revenue, including the "mortgage tax law," should be amended so as to insure an equal and just distribution of taxation upon all the property real and personal in the state.  
9. That we demand of the next session of the legislative assembly of the state the passage of a more just and efficient mechanics' lien law.  
10. We renew our declarations in favor of restricting Chinese immigration to this country and demand such additional legislation by congress as is necessary to effectually prevent any evasion of the laws now in force on that subject.  
11. That we favor the enactment of a good and sufficient registry law, to the end that illegal voting may be prevented.  
12. That the Republicans of Oregon approve all legislation which tends to promote fidelity and efficiency in the civil service of the country, and we declare the Republican party pledged to civil service reform.  
13. That the convention cordially indorses the administration of President Arthur, whose broad statesmanship and good judgment in the details of administrative duty have won for him the approval of the entire country.
