

Cleveland's Political Funeral.

Though Cleveland may be suitable to the free traders and the Pharisees of New York city, he has less chance of success than if he were opposed by them, because the great mass of the people of the country are not champions of the wealthy importers and monopolists generally. Cleveland, in his position as Governor of New York, has used his influence in favor of the monopolists on every occasion. He vetoed anti-monopoly measures passed by a Republican Legislature, for which he is universally condemned by the working men, farmers and business men, generally, who carry on the business of the country, and are entitled to more consideration than the money sharks who want big interest on money invested, not satisfied or content with any reasonable profit.

Cleveland cannot carry New York city by much of a majority, if any without which, by at least sixty or seventy thousand, he has no show of carrying the State. Unless New York State is secured, the Democracy make no pretensions to gain the victory, and even with New York, must carry several more electoral votes in conjunction with a solid Southern vote of all the old slave States. The Republicans expect to see every Southern State favor the Democratic ticket, either by fair or foul means, although it is possible two or three may go Republican if all the voters turn out, and there is no hindrance to a free ballot and fair count.

Throughout New York State the working men and Irish American voters are coming out openly in favor of Blaine and Logan. Blaine Clubs, composed of former Democrats have been organized at Rochester, Utica, Buffalo, Syracuse, Troy, Albany, New York, Brooklyn and other places, and in New Jersey the same opposition to Cleveland is manifested by the bone and sinew of the country. Although the Democratic Governor of New Jersey sent congratulations to Cleveland, he is quoted as privately stating that the nomination is the worst that could have been made to secure success. Other Democratic State officers say New Jersey will go heavily against Cleveland, and a number of prominent Democratic leaders in that State are opposing him.

In New York city, such papers as the "Irish World," "Irish Nation," "Tablet" and "Freeman's Journal" have come out for Blaine and Logan, and the "American Celt" of St. Louis, the "Celt" of Denver, Col., and other heretofore Democratic journals are enthusiastically advocating the defeat of Cleveland, and the election of Blaine. In all the Eastern States the working people are for Blaine, and on this coast also, he will receive the largest vote ever given to any candidate for the Presidency.

A Church Organ for Blaine.

As the erratic Beecher has pronounced himself opposed to Blaine, the following extract from the "Church Union" one of the leading religious organs of the country, is timely and appropriate. The "Union" says:

The Republican nominee, James G. Blaine, is probably the best man for the place which he has been chosen to fill by the unanimous vote of the Republican States. He is the best known man throughout the whole country as a politician of mighty power, as a wise statesman, and as a "whole" combining the most fitting qualities for President of the United States of any one man holding any position before the public. When a great daily like the New York "Times" bolts against the best efforts of its own party and openly brings forward the petty opposition possible to the candidate most fairly and unanimously nominated by the party, that paper must "go politically, not Mr. Blaine." The "Times" cry for a new party is not from a conviction for any grand reforms, morally or politically, but the pretext is that a pure man is wanted for President. Well, the "Times" first choice was Judge Edmunds, who is believed by all Republicans to be a good, pure minded man. Edmunds has been a close student and a grand, talented, successful lawyer. He is not an overly ambitious or progressive character. He is a good man, and fills his sphere and calling in life well where he is. He was not wanted by the Republican party as its leader in 1884. The convention proved by the voice of the people that a strong, powerful, progressive mind was wanted, that could and would do something in great political and moral reforms for the nation, worthy of the position of President.
