

Chairman Jones' Opinion.

New York, Oct. 17.—Chairman Jones, of the Republican national committee, when asked to give his candid opinion on the result in Ohio, said: "I say that the result in Ohio is in the highest degree satisfactory. Three weeks ago we were assured that with energetic work there was a fair prospect of carrying the state by from 6000 to 8000. A later canvass enabled our friends there to give expectations of a plurality of 10,000 to 15,000. At no time have we claimed more. Of course many who were less informed placed their estimates at higher figures, but that the committee is not responsible for. The Ohio election presages in a certain degree the sentiment of the people on national questions. In fact, in a vote upon state affairs, individual preferences and prejudices operate largely in every locality. It is in nowise represented the strength of the national ticket. For instance, in one town alone, where 60 Irish Americans voted the Republican ticket, there are absolutely known to be 160 votes of that same class that will go to Blaine. Some percentage of the gain from the wage earning and Irish American elements alone in Ohio is exemplified in the vote of the larger cities. We will carry that state in November for Blaine and Logan by 40,000 majority. Furthermore, we will carry every northern state, and upon a careful examination New York state by 50,000 majority—in other words, Blaine will be stronger than the strength developed for the ticket in the local canvass."

Dear Bread in Europe.

There is a general outcry in Europe that, while wheat has gone down to the lowest point reached during the present century, bread remains as dear as ever. The bakers and millers are so far the only men who get the benefits of the beautiful crops. Bread sells in London at about four cents a pound, and pays 300 per cent. profit to the miller and baker. In some places in the southern part of England the same quality of bread is sold at a little over two cents a pound and pays good profit to the producer at that price. The astonished fact that the price of bread is so low in some places and so high in others is due to the fact that the price is paid for tea, coffee and other articles of first necessity at retail, and the unprecedentedly low prices at which they are sold wholesale. Tea, for instance, sells at auction in London at about 20 cents a pound, and cannot be bought at retail at less than 65 cents.

D. McSweeney who was arrested and imprisoned in Ireland, and over whom barrels of crocodile tears have been shed, by the Democratic party during the present campaign, was once admitted to citizenship in America. He afterward returned to Ireland and accepted an official position which he was filling at the time of his arrest, and which he continued to fill after his release, until very recently when his services were needed to help the free trade party out in America. Mark the point, he could not be sworn into office in Ireland without taking the oath of allegiance to the British government, which dissolved all his allegiance to and rights under the United States government. That is the whole story and the reason that the state department of which Mr. Blaine was the head was unable to secure his release until such times as the British Government saw fit to do so. The man or paper who lends itself to the perpetuation of this slander belongs to the class that will tell a lie on a true rather than truth for cash. John T. Finerty, at Chicago, an Irishman by birth, a Democratic congressman at the present time and editor of the Chicago Citizen says the attacks on Blaine over this matter are "gross mistakes" that he did his full duty under the circumstances.

The London Times, commenting on the Ohio election and its bearing on the Presidential election, says: "When the election has been decided, free trade will probably become the dominating and dividing question in America." This is born of English hope. If Blaine is elected free trade is not likely to be again heard of for a generation.

The plurality majority of the Democrats in West Virginia at the election last week was 4,036. When we compare this with the Democratic plurality in 1880 of 16,136, we see what a gain has been made by the Republican party in that State. Only a little more effort on the part of the Republicans and the electoral vote of West Virginia can be counted for Blaine and Logan.

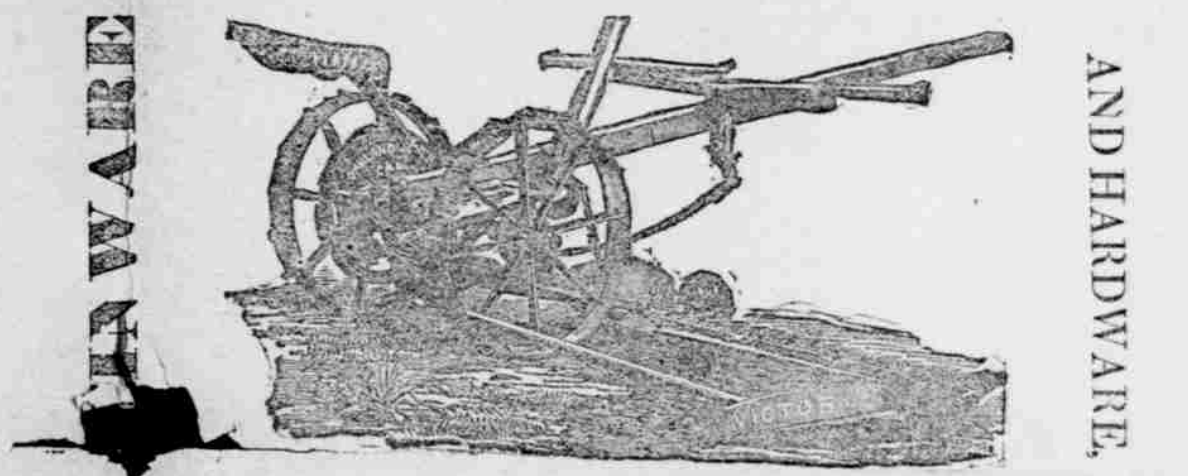
