ABDUCTION.—A warrant for the arrest of the Chinaman that got married here last week was received from Walla Walla, W. T., last Tuesday when Marshal Curtis and Constable Crosby arrested the couple also taking along another Chinaman that seemed to have some hand in the matter, the crime charged being abduction. To the right was the blue line of the Cascade range with Mt. McLoughlin in its spotless covering of snow in bold relief in the center, and a lower peak in the distance; Mt. Mount Roxie the venerable sentinel of pioneer days, from which flashed the signal of fires of the savages, striking terror to the heart of the few that dared to penetrate to this little Eden, by their wretched wicked light, completed the magic circle. Below us Bear creek flowed to its confluence with Rogue River, and the magnificent foliage of the many shrubs and trees that bordered its banks completed the enchanting scene of loveliness by which we were surrounded. The possible extent of the great mine, with its shining ore that lay around us had ceased to charm us as we thought in our awe and humble reverence of the Hand that had gathered in so small a space, so many mute testimonials of this mysterious love and goodness. The precious metal that lay hidden in the earth beneath us told us of the wonderful riches of His love that we could only hope to merit by faith in its inexhaustible bounty and labor in its vineyards. Tah Rock, dark and frowning spoke to us of the Great Being who had existed a ways and would exist forever and who had hurried in the fury of elemental strife amidst the beauty of its surroundings that it might stand through succeeding ages as in evidence of the power and justice of the One who had existed before the mountain were: The solemnly murmuring waterfall that fell as it journeyed on to the sea whirled us up of the "green pastures and still waters" of the higher life with the great Ocean of God's eternal goodness beckoning us on in the distance. The towering snow capped mountain reminded us of the immutability of His promise that is "unto you and your children and to those who are afar off even as many as the Lord and God shall call. The bloom and beauty that was spread out magnificent profusion of our feet told us of the house of many mansions and of the inexhaustible goodness of the One, who is gathering all the nations of the earth into His kingdom. Not a human habitation, or mark of desecration near the scene that would be a fit subject for the hands of the old Masters, and all can feast upon the loveliness, even as they can partake of the blessing of Eternal Goodness "without money and without price.
