

Herat.

THE CITY THEY BOTH WANT.

The city of Herat, which is, under the present indications, the prize for which England and Russia are ultimately contending, possesses a geographical importance of such a nature as has for many centuries made it the point for furious fighting among tribes and nations. Again and again it has been made the focus for Persian fury and ambition, and it is only by continual hard fighting it remains in the hands of the ameer of Afghanistan. When England obtained, by intrigues, chicane and hard fighting, dominant control of Hindustan, she fully recognized Herat as one of the points d'appui from which an enemy might threaten that dominance, and hence it became the fashion to name the city "The gate of India." Situated picturesquely upon a spur of the Hindu Kush range, and surrounded by a bewildering network of deeply irrigated rice fields—no bewildering that cavalry operations are made impossible with any freedom of action—Herat is at the same time powerfully fortified artificially. Recent Russian travelers have averred that nowhere in the east is the art of canalization carried on so thoroughly or on so vast a scale as it has been in the valley of Herat, where the waters of the Hari-Rood are utilized to the utmost extent. The state of circumstances naturally makes Herat a valuable base of supplies for any army that may be fortunate enough to obtain possession of it. It is, therefore, no wonder that Herat has become a singularly important point of central Asia commerce, roads forking from it into Persia, to Cabul, Candahar, to Beloochistan, and northward through the Merv oasis and Turkestan, more especially that part of Turkestan which is known as B. khara. The city is nearly quadrangular, with faces about a mile long, and the high inner wall of defense is pierced by four gates, pointing towards different great cities with which it has communication. Thus, for instance, the great gates in the celebrated walls of Delhi were known as the Lahore gate, Cashmere gate, and so on. The stupendous earthwork upon which Herat is built has been the wonder of modern times, being, according to Sir Henry Rawlinson, the great English authority on eastern matters, 250 feet in width at the base, 50 feet high, and 14 wide at the top, and supported by no fewer than 150 circular towers, which again are protected by a ditch 45 feet wide and 15 feet in depth. There have been disputes about the true strength of the fortress. In 1816 Gen. Ferrier, of the British army, gave it as his opinion that the place was only an immense redoubt which a European army could reduce in 20 days, but it is significant that in 1837, with the assistance of two engineer lieutenants, the Heratens successfully held at bay for 10 months a Persian army of 35,000 men, supported by 50 pieces of artillery, which were in many cases directed by Russian officers. The mosques of Herat are made exceedingly picturesque by bluish tasseled tiles; the bazaars are rich and swarmy and night with motley groups of men drawn from every part of central Asia, Afghanistan and India; and bearing in mind all these facts, together with the fortuitous geographical position of Herat, it is no wonder that the famous city is coveted both by Russia and England. It possesses the unenviable reputation of being one of three cities so happily situated by nature that it must become perpetually the object of every nation placed in its vicinity.

Oregon Presbytery.

The regular spring meeting of the Presbytery of Oregon took place at the Presbyterian church of Ashland, April 14th and 15th. Owing to the indisposition of Rev. E. J. Thompson of Salem, Rev. E. R. Murgatroyd preached the opening sermon on Tuesday evening. At the close of the service, in the absence of the moderator the Presbytery was called to order by the state clerk Rev. J. V. Milligan and constituted with prayer by Rev. M. A. Williams. Rev. D. O. Ghomley of East Portland was chosen moderator for the ensuing year, and immediately assumed the duties of the chair. The minutes of the fall meeting at East Portland, of the adjourned meetings at Seattle, W. T., and Astoria and Salem and of the PRO RENATA meeting at Portland were read and approved. The report of the committee of arrangements was read and adopted. On motion it was agreed that the devotional services of Thursday morning be thanksgiving in their character for the manner in which God had signally blessed most of our churches during the past winter. Adjourned to meet Wednesday morning at 8:30 o'clock. The devotional services of Wednesday morning were led by Rev. M. A. Williams, and Presbytery proceeded to matters in hand. Rev. Hogue of Corvallis and Rev. McFarland of Eugene were received as members on presentation of regular certificates. The organization of St. John's Presbyterian church of North Portland was received and accepted. The informal organization of Myrtle creek and Medford churches were approved and pastors thereof instructed to complete the organization by the ordination of duly elected elders. Rev. A. C. Fairchild of the M. E. church and Wm. Withoff of the German reformed church were invited to sit as corresponding members. Reports of various committees were received and discussed. Afternoon session consisted of an interludicary meeting, during which the narrators of the state of religion within the different fields were read by the ministers in charge, and the narrations remanded to the chairman of the committee on narrations, Rev. A. R. Bickenbach to be written into a separate narrations and sent to the state clerk of the general Assembly. After the hearing, reports from several of the committees on church records, the Presbytery adjourned with prayer. In the evening an eloquent sermon was delivered by Rev. A. L. Lindsay, D. D. of Portland. At the close of services Presbytery proceeded to business. The remaining church records passed under the examination of committees and were duly reported. Rev. J. N. Milligan of Ashland, was chosen first commissioner of the Presbytery of Oregon to the general Assembly of the Presbyterian church of the United States.

The devotional exercises of Thursday morning were conducted by Rev. E. R. Geary, D. D., of Eugene City, and the code of business for the day taken up. Rev. A. L. Lindsay, of Portland, was elected second commissioner to the general assembly of the United States to represent specially the interests and wants of the Albany Collegiate Institute to the Eastern churches. The Overture from general Assembly to the Presbyteries were considered separately. Rev. D. O. Ghomley presented the report of the committee on temperance. The report was received, the work commended and the committee retained in the performance of these duties. At the afternoon session the report of committee on home missions was received and approved from the churches of Roseburg, Eugene City, Oakland, Wilbur, Brownsville, Clatskanie, North Yamhill, Albany, Tualatin, Plains, B-aver creek, and North Portland. A call for the pastoral services of Rev. H. J. Laughlin of the church of North Portland was placed in the hands of a special committee, approved by them and tendered to Rev. R. J. Laughlin by the moderator, and accepted by him. The evening sermon was preached by Rev. E. T. Lockard of Independence. At the close of the business the Presbytery proceeded to the completion of its business. Mr. J. M. Adair coadjutor of the Presbytery board of publications made his annual report which was accepted and the work commended. Resolutions were read and adopted commending the work done by S. S. Caldwell of Lakeview and regretting his departure. Resolutions of respect to the memory of the Rev. Henry Cana, deceased, were read and approved. The usual resolutions of thanks for hospitality shown delegates were unanimously adopted, after which the Presbytery was adjourned by prayer to meet at North Portland in October.

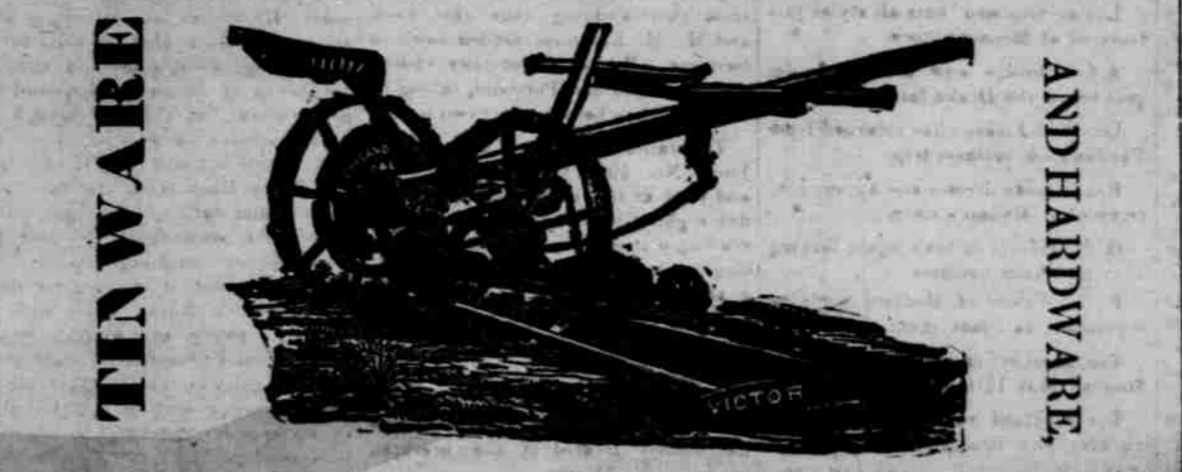
