

The Special Session.

PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR, CALLING UPON THE LEGISLATURE TO ASSEMBLE NOVEMBER 9.

SALEM, Ogn., Oct. 12, 1885.

Whereas matters of vital importance to the people of the State of Oregon seem to require the convening of the Legislative assembly in special session.

Now, therefore, I, Z. F. Moody, by virtue of the authority in me vested, as Governor of the State of Oregon, do hereby direct the convening of the two houses of the Legislative assembly of the State of Oregon in special session at the state capitol in Salem on Monday, Nov. 9, 1885, at 2 o'clock p. m., of which all who shall at that time be entitled to act as members of said body are hereby required to take notice.

Given under my hand, and the great seal of the State of Oregon, this 12th day of October, A. D., 1885.

Special Session.

Governor Moody, as will be seen by his official proclamation published elsewhere, has called a special session of the Legislature to convene at Salem November 9th. We think the Governor did right and for this action will be fully sustained by the Republican party in Oregon.

It now remains for the members of the General Assembly to demonstrate their worthiness of the confidence which we have imposed in them. It has been insisted, if the Governor would call a special session, that the members would meet in a spirit of compromise and conservatism, and not only elect a United States Senator, but, as far as possible, perfect the imperfect legislation of the last session, and enact such other desirable laws as failed by reason of the unfortunate discussions growing out of the election of Senator. This confidence in the wisdom and patriotism of the members has been decided by other parties in the State, but is none the less firmly entertained on that account.

The Republicans of the United States have felt the greatest interest in the Senatorial contest in this State, and they will without doubt heartily approve the Governor's action in giving the Legislature another opportunity to rectify the mistake of the last session. It cannot be that they will experience another disappointment, growing out of the obstinacy and factious spirit of any of the members of the Assembly. On the contrary, we feel disposed to promise them a representative from Oregon in the United States Senate that will be worthy the State and the great party which so long directed the destiny of the nation.

Unofficial returns from nearly all the precincts canvassed since midnight in Ohio make Forsaker's plurality touch 21,000, with the rest of the ticket likely to exceed that, and 23,000 votes for the prohibitionists and 2000 for the greenbackers, on a total vote of over 700,000. The legislature is Republican on joint ballot, without the fourteen members from Hamilton county, by at least five and probably nine, but with Hamilton county the senate will probably have one Democratic majority. With Hamilton county the Republicans would have thirty-three majority on joint ballot, and a working majority in each branch.

Inquiry at the banks by an "Oregonian" reporter elicits the information that people who are entitled to credit can get all the money they want. There is no vast amount hoarded up, but the banks have all they need for legitimate demands. The usual amount has been advanced on wheat—probably more than at this time last year, because the crop was harvested earlier. So far as could be learned, the circulating medium is fully equal to the requirements of the trade; hence the money market may be set down as healthy.

Remarks the "Astorian": "Last they should 'get mad' and forget it, one of the first things the legislature might, could, would or should do after convening in special session, is to fix things so that Judge Taylor is not by law obliged to open court in Astoria on the same day. The Judge is not given to spreading himself, but even if he were the straddler it is too great."

Ohio has given a decisive majority for the Republicans and the Governor of Oregon has called a special session of the Legislature, thereby insuring another Republican U. S. Senator. Why shouldn't the offensive partisan feel proud?
