

Curry County.

The Oregon State Board of Immigration has issued a pamphlet of 64 pages, entitled "Oregon as It Is." It claims to be authentic and asserts that its statements are "solid facts." It speaks of Curry County as follows:

"This is one of the coast counties, and lies along the Pacific shore for upwards of 100 miles. In its area of 1,500 square miles it embraces hills, valleys, plains and mountains. Some of the elevations are covered with heavy growths of fir, live oak and cedar, while others are bald, supporting a luxuriant growth of grass. Rogue River whose principal tributary is the Illinois, finds its way to the ocean across the central portion of Curry County. The other streams of the county, all of which flow into the ocean, are Now, Sixes, Pistol, Chetco, Windchuck and Elk rivers, and Floras, Brush and Eschere creeks. On all these streams are tracts of rich alluvial bottom lands, while there is much fine agricultural land in the valleys scattered here and there in mountains. The grass hills afford splendid grazing for cattle and sheep. Much land is yet open to settlement. Thousands of acres of timber land, advantageously located can be purchased from the Government at \$2.50 per acre or can be homesteaded. The salmon run in all the rivers is large. A cannery at Ellensburg is doing an extensive business. The shipping points are Ellensburg and Port Orford, the latter needing only a small breakwater to make it accessible for shipping purposes to the largest vessels that float. In this respect and in the matter of its resources and industries, it is similar to Coos, its nearest neighbor on the north. The climate is mild and moist. It has a population of about 2,300, most of the people being engaged in stock raising. Its area is mainly mountainous and very little of it has been surveyed. The people support themselves by sheep-raising, darning, lumbering, fishing and placer mining. The arable land under cultivation produces sufficiently for home consumption."

An Oregon Horse Thief.

Sheriff E. Putnam and J. L. Hanks, of Linkville, Oregon, were in town Tuesday, in search of Chas. Wilson, who some three weeks since stole two fine horses from Mr. Hanks. The owner of the horses was away from home when the theft was committed, and did not know of it for a week, hence the thief had a splendid start. He was tracked to Anderson, where one of the horses was found in Coffey's livery stable, badly used up from the long trip. Wilson made the trip from Linkville to Anderson, a distance of over two hundred miles, in less than four days, traveling 75 miles the first day, over rough mountain roads. He remained in town a week, stopping at the Anderson hotel, when he decamped suddenly, leaving the used up horse in the stable, and letting slip his memory the fact that he was indebted to the hotel keeper for board. From here Wilson went to Red Bluff, where he sold the other animal to a stable keeper, and after enjoying himself for a few days on the money received for the animal, disappeared, since which time he has not been heard of. His trip from Oregon was made in quick time, as he rested in Big Valley an entire day. Sheriff Putnam and Mr. Hanks were over six days on the road, and consider that good time.—[Shasta Echo.]
