The Oregon Pacific.

The coming of the Oregon Pacific Railroad has not only reduced freights but the promptness with which it delivered freight last season was something unprecedented in this valley.

The Indian Bureau is about to send out a commission consisting of a special agent and an Indian inspector to visit the Umatilla Reservation in Oregon, with a view to inducing the Indians to take up lands in severalty, under the act of March 3, 1880.

The Interior Department yesterday allowed J. H. Bean \$450, and Samuel C. Moore, \$500, both of Douglas county, Oregon, for Indian deprivations in 1856.
