The Work of the Forty-Ninth Congress.

Its sins are sins of omission. It did not reform the currency muddle nor the tariff; it remitted nothing of the surplus taxes; it refused money for fortifications and guns; it passed no bankruptcy law; it failed to legislate to carry into effect the Mexican commercial treaty; through corruption influences in the senate several land forfeiture bills and the bill repealing the Pre-emption Timber Culture and Desert Lands laws were defeated; the Oklahoma bill, the constitutional amendment to change the time of the meeting of congress and several important measures failed.

On the other hand, we take from the report of a Washington correspondent the following list of important acts. It passed laws—

1. Settling the succession to the Presidency.
2. Regulating the counting of electoral votes.
3. Repealing the Tenure of the Office act.
4. Forfeiting and restoring to the public domain about fifty million acres of land.
5. Prohibiting the ownership of land by aliens.
6. Effectively dealing with the crime of polygamy.
7. Referring all private claims to the Court of claims.
8. Giving money for fast cruisers and for steel guns for all the new ships.
9. Ordering a thorough inquiry into the affairs and management of the Pacific railroads.
10. Authorizing the president to deal with the fishery troubles.
11. Regulating interstate commerce.
12. Reducing the fees on postal money orders.
13. Extending the free delivery system to cities of 10,000 inhabitants.
14. Relieving the merchant marine of a number of vexatious and needless burdens.
15. Redeeming trade dollars.
16. Prohibiting the use of convict labor on public buildings.
17. Ordering the adjustment of railroad land grants.
18. Allowing lands in severalty to Indians.
19. Authorizing the issue of small silver certificates.
20. Giving money for congressional library.

Many of these laws are of very great public importance, and the work of this Cleveland Congress compares admirably with that of any congress for a dozen years past.

The faults of the democrats in this Congress were bad for themselves, but the country does not suffer from them. The democratic leaders in both houses thought more of settling old scores between themselves than of uniting upon a defined policy, and they seemed to think it good for the party to have as little relation as possible with the democratic administration. Their propensity to quarrel among themselves and with the President placed them at a serious disadvantage as against the astute and practiced republicans.—[N. Y. Herald.]

The bill changing the name of a county from St. John to Logan caused a commotion in the Kansas Legislature greater than the telegraphic reports represented. Numerous bitter speeches were made; the Republicans denounced St. John as an "infamous traitor," most of the Democrats voted for the change and, strangely enough, all about half of the prohibitionists supported the bill.

BILL NYE'S AFFLICTION.

I am just having a highly humorous experience with bills. To others this announcement will come with no element of sadness, perhaps, but to me it brings a thrill of the keenest and most poignant anguish. A man might go all over a whole county and not find any thing more poignant than these bills seem to me.

There are seven of these little blossoms, and they hang in a ripe cluster on the back of my neck, about two inches below what the phrenologists call love of home.

I had never brought out a bill until last week, though I have led a very checkered life, but on Thursday morning I awoke to find myself the parent of seven cunning little red-headed bills about the size of pumpkin-seeds.

They are small, but oh how restless they are, and how they struggle with each other for supremacy!

People who live here (Asheville, N. C.) say these bills are a result of the climate. The air here is especially calculated to bring out any thing in the line of latent humor. A man who had been running a humorous weekly paper in the far west came here and in two weeks he broke out so that his friends had to do him up in a possum seven feet long.

I am not doing much for these bills, because I want to teach them to be self-reliant and depend upon themselves. One of them was a puny little thing at first, and I felt sorry for it when my friends told me about it. I can not see these bills, of course, as they are not in the direct line of vision, being on the back of my neck. So I got a friend—one I can trust—and I let him come and let me how they are doing from time to time.

This little bill at first did not bid fair to hold out more than a day or two, but yesterday it began to throw aside its lethargy and to realize that life is real. It is fully abreast of the others now and has a large and very active crater to it.

For three days I put various things on the bills; among others soap, sugar, the white of an egg, ground flaxseed, bread and milk, bread and molasses, etc., etc. There were other things recommended, but as the bills were all in a cluster I had to try one thing at a time. With seven bills well distributed I might have tried several remedies at once, but I did the best I could. In three days I have rendered thirteen dollars worth of groceries entirely useless to the consumer.

One great difficulty has been the unsatisfactory results of my efforts to get any sleep. Before I was overtaken by bill-evil I used to rest on the back of my head and neck at night a good deal, but after a few experiments with my head pillowed on these seven little hot-headed bills I found that it made my head too high.

Bills visit the rich and poor alike, the well-to-do and the exalted. They are not a mark of greatness, for bills frequently come to the obscure and the unknown. They do not come with the seeking, and they are not to be obtained by study and effort. Bills fall to the lot of many whose lives would otherwise be void of incident. SHORT TALKS WITH MY DOGS.

Boys, do not try to learn to use tobacco. Stop a minute and let us consider the matter. Why should you wish to learn? Oh! "because Harry uses it," that is your reason. Well, does it do Harry any good? You "don't know as it does." Very well then, let's consider the reasons against its use. In the first place it is injurious to the health; it is so expensive, and moreover filthy. Now how do the boys and noses balance? Don't for a moment imagine it a smart thing to do. Any fool can learn to use it but it some times takes a smart boy to have manliness to refuse to do what his silly mates are doing. By this I do not mean to be understood as saying only fools use tobacco but I do say that there is nothing smart or manly in learning to use it. Nothing smart, but that other thing people designate with a sneer as "smarty."

I have nothing severe to say to those who have become confirmed in the habit of using the weed, for habit is as remorseless as a pair of handcuffs, but I have no patience with the beginner who will nauseate himself, and suffer the torture of acclimating himself to the nuisance, when he would be a great deal better without it. We hear every day of cases of heart disease aggravated by the use of tobacco; of that horror, smokers cancer, and now comes a report from London of blindness from the same cause. Here is what a London paper says on the subject:

"Tobacco blindness is becoming a common affliction. At present there are several persons under treatment for it at one London hospital. It first takes the form of color blindness, the sufferers who have smoked themselves into this condition being unable to distinguish the color of a piece of red cloth laid up before them. Sometimes the victim loses his sight altogether. Although smoking is to a large extent the cause of the malady, heavy drinking is also partly responsible.

The use of tobacco shortens life. Its direct tendency is to deplete, enfeeble, and undermine the whole man. Dr. Shaw specifies over eighty diseases which may be traced to this cause. German physicians also, state that of the deaths in Germany of young men from the age of eighteen to twenty-five more than half are from tobacco. Tobacco is a deceiver. "I did not realize its power," said a doctor of divinity, "till I gave it up;" and thousands thus emancipated have confessed its subtle influence.—[Sel.]

Commissioner Sparks has succeeded in making himself very unpopular with the people of the territories; he seems to have brought about his ears such a buzzing that he naturally imagines he has unconsciously stirred up a hornet's nest. The occasion of all this official terror and consternation is the vast accumulation of land contests, brought about by his wonderfully vigorous "reform" policy, and, as matters stand, the work of the General Land Office is completely blocked by them, while the Attorney-General's work is fully two years behind in consequence. These contests, in four cases out of five, represent the actual persecution of poor settlers, who have been struggling hard to get a start in the world, only to be ruined by this species of democratic "reform." As a result, the Commissioner is begging congress for more help, and it is estimated that his economy and "reform" will entail an extraordinary expense to the government of more than fifty thousand dollars per year for many years to come—a sum far in excess of the value of the property involved. The situation is an interesting one for the public, but is like the sudden sitting down upon a carpet lake to Mr. Sparks.—[Chicago Graphic News.]

It is claimed by free traders that England is a free trade country, and they cite her progress upon the ground that she collects no import duties. The truth is there are fifty-three articles upon which such duties are collected, and the amount of £100,000,000 is annually added to the imperial treasury therefrom. This exceeds half the custom revenue of this country, is twice as much as collected by Germany, and is nearly twice as much as collected by France. An exchange asserts that both France and Germany avowedly and consistently adopt the principle of protective tariff, as we do, while England pretends to believe in and follow the principle of free trade. The fact is that England is as much of a protective tariff country as any in the world. The only difference is that it applies the principle differently to suit its different situations and interests.—[Sun.]

A strange case of absent-mindedness recently came to light in the office of the Recorder of Deeds at Washington. In July, 1884, a gentleman had a deed made of record, also a deed of trust, Frederick Douglass at that time being recorder. Subsequently a deed of release was secured, and last week the papers were returned for further record. In examining the deed it was dated as of July 16, 1884, and on the back "James G. Blaine, Recorder of Deeds," in the handwriting of Mr. Douglass, showing that the late recorder was at that time absorbed in mind about the Blaine boom to such an extent as to write that gentleman's name where the recorder's should have appeared.

Americans drank 642,000,000 gallons of beer last year. This with 70,703,010 gallons of whiskey, kept them in a reasonably glorious state "over all the life of life victorious." We use much more tobacco now than before and in forms less healthy. The cigarette is largely on the increase which shows that the American brain is gradually softening. Last year the increase in cigarettes was twenty-five per cent. America smoked 1,210,550,215 cigarettes; 3,510,372,589 cigars were smoked.

Mr. Cleveland has not done himself credit in the closing days of the session. He has been unreasonable, stubborn and arrogant. His silly refusal to attend upon the senate yesterday forenoon was made ludicrous by his appearance in the nick of time to save the bill providing for the expenses of the White House kitchen. Other presidents, bigger and better men than Mr. Cleveland, have deemed it a violation of the presidential dignity to be where they were needed when they were needed.
