Yet our contempt for its motive need not prevent our profiting by an enemy's warning. Such a result as repudiation of our national debt is impossible-we intend to pay it, which is more than England expects to do with hers. But the best way to make such a result inconceivs able by foreigners is to hasten reunion, and bring the resources and the taxpaying common stock of the country.
