FARM ITEMS.

A writer in the Country Gentleman, in speaking of the value of sheep to pasture-lands, has these remarks: "I think there is another reason why the sheep improve the wifd, bushy pasture besides the fertility which their manure imparts to it. Orch. ardists are sometimes made too familiar with the strong propensities which sheep often have, to strip leaves as well as bark from young trees. This propensity may be turned to excellent account by confining them in pastures infested with bushes throughout the season. At certain times they will make an assault upon these bushes, and by keeping them stripped, enfeeble or destroy them."




