Eggs—How to Pack Them—The following directions are given, by one who has had a good deal of egg packing to do, as the best method:

"Always use clean ovals. First put them one inch deep in the bottom of the barrel; then a pretty firm sheet of paper; then a half inch of oats again, well pressed; then eggs, ends up, followed by oats and eggs as before, but working each layer of oats with the hand singly down around the eggs next the barrel, as well as rubbing them effectually in between each of the eggs in the layers."

I use a board some six or eight inches square, with a loop or staple in the center, for pressing each layer of oats firmly down. There will be something gained by lifting and dropping the barrel square on the end, but not by shaking, as it disturbs the layers. When it gets too heavy to lift, use a board three fourths as large as the head, and get on it, increasing your weight with a spring. End as you begin, with paper and oats, getting on the head and driving it in. The secret lies all in packing the oats. Oats are better worth sending to market than hay, and just as safe. I have sent ten barrels at a time without losing a single egg. You must pack tight. Remember that."

How to Save Tools.

Have a place for every tool, no matter how insignificant it may be, and on closing shop, see, or cause to be seen, that every tool is in its place. This, though an old rule, has been the foundation of the success of a man. Another good rule is to keep your tools sharp, and in otherwise good order. The hands will never lose sight of them, so long as they are in usable condition. And still another rule, is never to buy any but the very best tools to be procured either at home or abroad. A poor workman may turn out tolerable work with good tools, when a good workman can do nothing but botch with bad tools.

PEACHES WITHOUT STONES.—An agriculturist has, it is said, tried with success the following method of making peaches grow without stones:

Turn the tops of the trees down, cut off the ends, stick them into the ground and fasten them so with stakes; in a year or two those tops will take root, and when well rooted cut off the branches connecting those reversed and rooted branches with the tree proper, and the reversed peach trees will produce fine peaches without stones. The same experiment may be tried with plums, cherries, and currants.

REPUBLICAN PLATFORM Adopted at Salem, March 24th 1868.

1. Resolved, That it is the highest duty of every American citizen to maintain against all enemies the integrity of the Union, and to preserve the Constitution and laws of the United States, and to preserve at the ballot-box the fruits of the late war.

2. Resolved, That the work of reconstruction of the Southern States belongs to the legislative department of the government, and that we endorse the thirteenth and fourteenth amendments to the Constitution, and the acts of Congress commonly called the reconstruction acts, as the best plan yet proposed for the restoration of the States loyal in rebellion to their former relations to the Federal Government.

3. Resolved, That we are in favor of admitting the rebel States to representation in Congress at the earliest practicable moment which the public safety will permit.

4. Resolved, That the national debt was necessarily contracted to save the national life, and ought to be honestly paid, and we condemn every scheme devised for the repudiation of the whole or any part of the debt as derogatory to the Republic and injurious to its citizens.

5. Resolved, That, under the Constitution, the Federal Government has no right to interfere with the elective franchise in any State having representation in Congress, and that the government is not to be overthrown by rebellion.

6. Resolved, That the right of expatriation is the natural and inherent right of the citizen, and that the enjoyment of the rights of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness; and that while the citizen owes allegiance to the Government, the Government owes protection to the citizen, and that it is the duty of the Government of the United States to protect all its citizens, native born and naturalized, in the full enjoyment of the rights and liberties of the United States, wherever and under whatever color or pretense those rights may be invaded.

7. Resolved, That the foreign immunities which have added so much to the wealth, development of resources, and increase of power of this nation, the rights of all nations, should be fostered and encouraged by a liberal and just policy; and that we sympathize with all people everywhere who are struggling for civil and religious liberty.

8. Resolved, That the thanks of the American people are due to the soldiers and sailors of the army and navy who have secured the independence of their country and in vindication of the honor of their flag; that the nation owes to them gratitude and the recognition of their patriotism and their valor, and ample and permanent provision for those of their survivors who have received disabling and honorable wounds in the service of their country, and that the names of all nations who have fallen in its defense shall be held in grateful and everlasting remembrance.

9. Resolved, That we are in favor of liberal appropriations of land and money, by the Government, to aid in the construction of railroads.
