LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES, PASSED AT THE SECOND SESSION OF THE 40TH CONGRESS.

No. 51 .- An Act relative to tiling reports of railroad companies. Ba it enacted by the Senate and House Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the raports required to be made to the Secretary the Treasury on or before the first day of July of each year, by the corporations created by or entitled to subsidies under the pro visions of an act entitled "An act to aid in the construction of a railroad and telegraph line from the Missouri river to the Pacific ocean, and to secure to the government the use of the same for postal, military and other purposes," approved, July 1, 1862, and the acts supplemental to and amendatory thereof shall hereafter be made to the Secretary of the Interior, on or before the first day of October of each year. Said reports shall furn ish full and specific information upon the several points mentioned in the 20th section therein prescribed, and on failure to make the same as herein required, the issue of attend. By order of bonds or patents to the company in default shall be suspended until the requirements of this act shall be complied with by such com-pany. And the reports hitherto made to the Secretary of the treasury under the said act of July 1, 1862, shall be transferred and

delivered by him to the Secretary of the Interior, to be filed by him Sec. 2. And beit further enacted, That the corporations created by the provisions of the acts of congress approved July 2, 1864, and fuly 27, 1866, and known as the Northern to the Secretary of the Interior on or before the first of October of each year, as are required to be made by the Union Pacific Ratl nd and branches, under the provisions of the first section of this act, and on failure to do so shall be subject to the like suspension. Sec. 3. And be it further enected. That the reports required from the commissioners appointed to examine and report in relation to the road of any of the corporations whereto reference is made in this act, shall be adressed to and filed in the Department of the Interior; and all such reports heretofore made shall be transferred to and filed in said Department of the Interior; and so much of any and all acts as requires any reports from such companies, or any officers thereof to be made to the Secretary of the Treasury

Sec. to AM to it further engeted, That in a addition to the night subjects referred to in section 20 of the act of July 1552, to be reannually to the Secretary of the Interior all reports of engineers, superintendents, or other officers who make annually reports to any of said railroad companies. Approved, June 25, 1868.

No. 55 .- An Act relating to the Supreme Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Reposeclatives of the United States of America That in case of a vacancy in the office of Chief Justice of the Supreme court of the United States, or of his inability to discharge the powers and duties of said office, the same shall devolve upon the associate justice of said court, whose commission is senior in time, until such mability shall be removed or another appointment shall be duly made and the person so appointed shall be dely qualified, and this act shall apply to every person succeeding to the office of Chief Jus-

No. 56 .- An act to authorize the Secretary of the Treasury to change the names of cer-Be it enacted by the Sevate and House of Rep-resentatives of the United States of America

tice, pursuant to its provisions.

Approved, June 25, 1868.

That the Secretary of the Treasury be, and hereby is, authorized to change the name of the yacht W. W. Alell, owned by James Lloyd Greene, of Norwich, Connecticut, administrator of the estate of Benjamin D. Greene, late of said Norwich decessed, and John Jeffries, je., of Boston, Mass., to that of Ethel, and also to change the name of the yacht L' Hiroadelle, owned by James Gordon Bennette, jr., of the city of New York, to that of Dauntless, and to grant said vessels registers in said respective names; the said vessels being pleasure yachts only, and not cugaged in commercial or other business. Approved, June 25, 1868.

No. 57 .- An Act relating to contested elections in the city of Washington, District of

Bs it enacted by the Senate and House of Rep-resentatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That whenever any person has received or shall bereafter receive a certificate from the register of the city of Washington, based upon satisfactory evidence furnished by the commissioners of election, notifying him of his election to any elective office of said city oth person receiving such notification shall be entitled to enter upon the discharge of the duties of his office, and the certificate of the register shall be prima facia evidence of his election to and right to discharge the duties of said office.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, That Hard Times Come Again no More!

any person who shall hinder or obstruct a person holding the certificate of election mentioned in the foregoing section from entering upon or discharging the duties of any court of competent jurisdiction, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding one thousand dollars, or be imprisoned in the county jail not exceeding six months, or both said. Sec. 3. And be it further enacted. That the supreme court of the District of Colum bia, or any judge thereof, shall have jurisdiction to enforce, by mandamus, or otherwise, the right of any person holding the BOOTS AND SHOES, the certificate mentioned in the first section Sec. 4. And be it further enacted. That

and person who claims, or shall hereafter claim, to be elected to any elective office in said city, may commence proceedings before the said supreme court of the District of Columbia, by petition setting forth the facts upon which he relies, and shall serve a copy on the incumbent or person who has received the certificate of election; and the person so served shall make answer to said petition within five days, and said court shall thereupon try the rights of the parties to said of tice in a summary manner; and for that pur pose a special session shall be called and held whenever necessary for the purposes of such trial; and the decision of said court in any case so brought before it, shall be final And when the legal organization of the board of aldermen or board of common conseil shall be delayed on account of any convest in relation to the election of any member of either of said boards, the mayor of said city is hereby authorized to make temporary appointments of all subor-dinate officers whose appointment or election is authorized by the said mayor and membrs of said boards under existing laws, to continue until said boards be legally organized.




