

LYNCHING IN CALIFORNIA.—The summary manner of meteing out Justice to grave offenders of the law by means of lynching, seems to have abated but little in California since she has taken her rank as one of the States of the federal Union. There are aggravated cases occurring continually in the interior of that country, but at this age and organization of the country we question the propriety of its continuance. During the infancy of the country there was no organization—no law, and no executors of laws—the country was full of desperadoes—under these circumstances, there may have been some plea of justification. Affairs have so far developed and the tone of the public mind has so much improved, that no reasonable grounds can be urged in favor of its continuance. The Sacramento Union gives the following account of one Andrew Scott's trial by an excited jury:

ANOTHER MAN HUNG.—Lynch law has again been carried into effect, and another murderer sent to his last account.

On Saturday, at Brown's bar, on Weber creek, Andrew Scott, of St. Genevieve, Mo., without any provocation further than a slight misunderstanding, murdered Mr. Baker, his partner, inflicting five severe stabs with his knife, any one of which would have caused his death.

Scott was taken into custody, and although the excitement occasioned by the dreadful act was intense, he was allowed trial by a jury of twelve men. After a fair representation of the whole case, the jury found him guilty, and sentenced him to be hung, which verdict was immediately put into execution.

Mr. Baker is said to have been a gentleman in every respect, while his murderer, beyond all doubt, was a most ferocious villain, this being the third or fourth time that he has stained his hands with the blood of his fellow man. One of his victims was Dr. McManus of St. Genevieve. His narrow escape from the gallows on that occasion, instead of acting as a salutary warning, and making him a better man, only served to harden his heart, as is too often the case with the vicious man when the law in mercy fails to execute its judgments upon him, and now he has reaped the terrible fruits of his own sowing. We understand he is most respectfully connected at home.
