Foreign Affairs.

The prospects of war between Russia and Turkey are by no means diminishing. The Turks have the lip sympathy of both France and England.

Breadstuffs have taken a rise in the eastern States in consequence of the wars and rumors of wars. We compile from various sources the subjoined extracts touching upon the subject.

Russia and Turkey.—The London Times of the 23rd inst. had received positive information from St. Petersburg, by the packet which left that capital for Stettin, on the evening of the 23rd of June, that on that day, on the return of the last courier from Constantinople, the Emperor of Russia had despatched immediate orders to his troops to cross the Pruth. It was expected that this determination would forthwith be announced to the Russian nation, and to foreign states, by a manifesto.

A letter dated Constantinople, June 16, gives the following intelligence:— "Couriers have brought dispatches by Belgrade, which assure the Porte of the union and complete understanding which animate the western powers.

The Turkish fleet will be in the Black Sea either tomorrow, or the day after. The American frigate Cumberland, under the command of Commodore S. Ringham, has obtained permission to accompany it.

The Turkish fleet is concentrated at the northern extremity of the Bosphorus, from Therapia to the Black Sea, and consists of 35 ships (two of three deckers), 10 frigates, 4 corvettes, 8 brig-sloops and 8 steamers.

The Paris correspondent of the Morning Chronicle states that the Porte, encouraged by the presence of the English and French fleets, had followed up their rejection of the Russian ultimatum by a demand of the armed intervention of the four great powers of Europe.

Public opinion seems strongly to favor the idea of taking the surplus money of the Treasury to build the Pacific railroad. But if a company was to do it, through the aid of the government in the shape of a loan, it would go on much more rapidly.

The war between Russia and Turkey is now quite probable, and the rest of Europe will be involved in it. Besides the present standing armies, two millions more men in the field and half a million at home preparing the implements of war, would be drawn from agricultural or manufacturing pursuits—instead of producers they will become consumers.

If a European war occurs, it is argued that our cotton interests will suffer. Not so, unless it be at the very outset. Our ships would become the carriers of part of the English goods to the various markets where they are now sold.

The only fear would be over-trading, over banking and over-speculating. There would be a big crash within three years.

The Newfoundland papers contain bitter complaints of the manner in which the French cutter drove the British fishermen from St. George's Bay.
