LECTURE.—"That Drinkard," by Mrs. P. Annetta Peckham, of San Francisco, at the M. E. Church, on Monday evening last, was without doubt an able effort; she is a lady of commanding presence, and a fluent speaker. She is a talented author. DISASTROUS FIRE.—Astoria has had a fire, the loss is heavy. Also The Dalles has had a disastrous fire which swept through the town and destroyed the business portion of the city. Loss \$100,000.

The fire broke out in a hotel on Front street, causing the citizens to turn out in full force. From houses to houses the flames spread until every one on Front street from Waldron's drug store to the Umatilla House, including that hotel, which was a store, short four blocks were a glowing ruin. The flames crossed to Second street and destroyed the business houses as far as French & McFarland's, where they again crossed the street destroying everything from the corner opposite Fred Fisher's old stand down as far as McWhorter's shop, including Humanson's brick building which was occupied by Mr. Newman. At this point the flames turned and swept everything before them down to Umatilla's last office on the corner of Third street. Having spent their fury and left a long stretch of ruin and devastation in their wake, it was thought that their progress could be checked at this point. The telegraph office, however, was not so easily deterred, and the flames, altogether, about a half dozen blocks of buildings were destroyed, and the total loss will not fall short of \$100,000. The United Engine and Maintenance office were a block away, hence safe.
