ANOTHER MYSTERY.

Umatilla will soon be entitled to the title of the "County of mysteries." A half dozen murders and disappearances have occurred during the past twelve months for which no explanation has been or can be given and right upon the heels of the case published in the EAST OREGONIAN of last week comes another. The particulars of this are as follows: Some week ago the Indians brought in a report that there was a wagon hid in the brush up on the Umatilla river on the opposite side from and between Winnamook's place and the agency buildings. On Sunday Sheriff Martin, S. L. Morse and Jim Jacobs went up to examine into the matter and found things very much as the Indians had represented them to be. There was a wagon containing a trunk in which were some clothes, a number of letters, needles, thread and some other articles, among which was a hair pin. There was also in the wagon a set of double harness, complete, with the exception of one bridle which was missing, a wool mattress and a lot of feed. On the ground near the wagon was an old camp fire and a box containing some provisions. The wagon had evidently been pulled down the gulch by one animal, as one of the single trees was fastened to the end of the tongue by an open link while the other with the whiffle tree was in the wagon. Van Townsend and Henry Barnhart, who had visited the spot ahead of this party, say there was a pistol, knife, monkey-wrench and bit and brace in the box when they were there but these articles had all disappeared before the sheriff went up. There was also written on the wagon seat a request that no one would disturb anything about the place, but it is thought some of the boys at the agency wrote it. From the letters found it is inferred the party with the wagon was named Jacob Burner as they were addressed to him, but what has become of him no man can, or will, tell. The party to whom they were addressed was evidently a man of means as some of the letters contained requests for loans, as much as \$500. They also speak of a wheat crop of 2000 bushels which the writer stated should have produced 4000. Some of the letters were written from Indiana. There was found also a portion of a copy of the *Detroit Free Press* dated Aug. 31st, and directed to "Sam A. Barnes"—Mr. Barnes lives in Weston and possibly can gather something from this circumstance. Three tracks of what seemed to be the heel of a woman's shoe were found some two hundred yards lower down and a place was noticed where some one had dipped a bucket of water from the river, but nothing could be gathered from it. We learn a fine, large work horse branded J B turned up at Mr. Brown's ranch on W. Id Horse about the time this wagon was probably left where found, but no one knows any thing about him.

REPUBLICAN CONSISTENCY.

The Virginia campaign now in progress exhibits in the highest degree the utter want of consistency in the Republican party. For the past ten years it has been a by-word and a reproach thrown out by the Republicans of the North that the Democrats of the South were repudiating their State debts—it has constituted a large element of their campaign thunder. Some Southern States did refuse to pay debts added upon them by the carpet bag governments which came into power at the close of the war and they were right in doing so, for they received no consideration for the money sought to be extorted from them. The case in Virginia is of a very different nature, however. The debt in controversy there was contracted before the war, the money applied on the erection of State buildings and public internal improvements and the State is in the enjoyment of them to-day. This debt the honest Democrats—the "Bourbons"—propose to pay. In this laudable effort, however, they are opposed by a motley crew of negroes, sore-headed political adventurers who heretofore affiliated with the Democratic party, and Republicans, backed by the Administration of the United States. The only Southern debt which should be paid the great party of advanced moral ideas says shall not be. They seek to cloak dishonesty in the garb of expediency and as the only palliative they can offer to the world for this unholy alliance, they allege that they are called from on high to purify the ballot box and to remove the illegal restraints put upon the elective franchise in that State and claim that the end justifies the means. How false and shallow this is! The only apology for a fact to substantiate this pretense is that the laws of Virginia require a man to pay a capitation tax of one dollar per year and do not allow of his voting unless this is paid. We claim that this law is reasonable—the tax is the same in amount as that of the State of Oregon and if the latter made its payment a pre-requisite to voting it would be better off for it to-day. The election laws of Virginia might be followed to advantage by many other States. There every voter must have his name registered in the precinct where he intends to vote ten days before the day of election and before voting must exhibit a receipt for the payment of his capitation tax. This is a wise and just provision against foreign immigration and "repeating." But when we come to consider the fact that this tax is levied to the maintenance of common schools in the State and that a large number of persons, both white and black, contribute nothing else to the support of these schools than this tax, while their children derive all the advantages that they afford, this outcry of the over-righteous Republicans appears in all its contemptible littleness. The mockery of their professions when brought into contrast with their attitude on the question of the debt of Virginia and free rum in North Carolina is enough to turn the stomach of an alligator.

THE RAILROAD.

Mr. P. Zahner, one of the chief engineers of the O. R. & N. Co., has kindly given us for publication some points concerning railroad matters. He returned from east of the Blue Mountains on Thursday last and the reason of his apparent recall has been a subject of considerable speculation with the public. Mr. Z. assures us, however, that as far as his knowledge extends it is a matter of no significance—that the division of which he had the management was assigned a portion of the line terminating at Snake river and had completed its work to that point. He knew of no hitch in the calculations of the company. As to the report which emanated in Boise about the trouble which it was thought the company would meet with in their pass through the mountains on account of Foster's toll road being purchased by Jay. Gould, Mr. Zahner said such talk was "all moonshine." From his knowledge of the line (which he ran in person) he says Foster's road is touched in only a few places and need not be at all if there were any occasion for a change of his route, but his idea was that the company would try the legal rights of Mr. Foster to his road charter rather than be put to any inconvenience on account of it. Mr. Zahner expressed his disappointment as a citizen of Pendleton that the road had not been put into running order to our town before this date and thought the failure was due to a lack of iron, which, however, was on the water. He could not say before seeing the managers of the company how soon the work of laying the tract to Pendleton would be commenced or when it would be completed.
