FOR HONOR OF ARMY

Sir Hector MacDonald Com-mits Suicide at the Hotel Regina in Paris.

WAS EN ROUTE TO CEYLON TO STAND HIS TRIAL.

Charges Against Him Said to Be Similar to Those Preferred Against Herr Krupp—Was a Hero of the Rank and File Who Called Him "Fighting Mac."

London, March 25.—Sir Hector MacDonald, whose trial was postponed because he left London that suicide would be committed in a hotel in Paris today. He was en route for Ceylon to stand his trial.

It became known this afternoon that charges were made against MacDonald by parents of boys who attended the English school at Ceylon. It is alleged his fall is due to his long barracks life in Eastern countries.

A story from a prominent club is that MacDonald had an intimation before he left London that suicide would be the best course to pursue in order that the honor of the army might be maintained.

The news of the suicide created an immense sensation, particularly in all military clubs where he was a prime favorite. He has always been a hero of rank and file and was called "Fighting Mac." His most daring charge was at the battle of Omdurman, where he was wounded and his brigade in the face of almost certain death, saved the day.

At Hotel Regina. Paris, March 25.—MacDonald arrived at Paris went to the hotel Regina. Shortly after he reached his room a shot was heard. The murderer on entering the room found him dead lying on the floor. The police took charge of the body and all the papers, including his diary and contents. It is believed that he made a statement before arriving at the hotel.

SUICIDE AT SUMPTER. Night Central Girl Takes Poison and Then Shoots Herself. Sumpter, Ore., March 25.—Vedra McVickers committed suicide about 5 o'clock Monday morning. Miss McVickers was the night central girl at the local telephone office and was about 21 years of age. She had been in the employ of the company for about two months.

The young lady first took poison and thinking she was making the poison would not take effect, she shot herself, the bullet entering her left breast just below the heart. Miss McVickers was well liked in Sumpter, her parents having resided here for the last two years. Her father is a carpenter and works in the town square in the city, and her mother is at present in a hospital in Portland. More particulars of the sad affair could not be ascertained, excepting that the cause of the suicide was a love affair.

SALLIE GO WAY BACK. Plymouth Rock Pulled of La Grande, Lays Three Four-Ounce Eggs in a Week. La Grande, March 24.—Sallie, the Portland White Leghorn-Black Spaniard, was hatched in Plymouth Rock pullet, owned by Mrs. H. C. Montgomery, laid three eggs last week, each of them weighing 3.5 ounces, the second production. One of them was weighed and balanced at four ounces. It was eight inches around the long end, and six inches around the short end. The pullet is being encouraged with hot bran mash and burned bones to further exertions.

Crazed with pain and fear, the woman leaped through the plate glass window of the car, and her screams brought assistance from several yards. The porter was arrested and later gave his name as G. W. Robinson. The woman is being held in a witness against him.
