Passenger Train Ran Into Rear End of a Freight Near Redhouse, New York.

SEVEN WERE KILLED AND 12 SERIOUSLY INJURED.

Several Passenger Cars Were Derailed and Two Sleepers Were Burned Five so Badly Burned That They Were Unrecognizable.

Jamestown, N. Y., April 20.-Four were killed and many injured in a wreck of the Erie passenger train at Redhouse, about 4 o'clock this morning. The passenger ran into the rear end of a freight, which was delayed in making a siding. Several passenger cars were derailed and two sleepers were burned. Three bodies have been recovered, but are unrecognizable.

Three More Reported Dead. A second dispatch says that in ad dition to the women and children reported killed, two pasengers in the day coach and a brakeman on the freight were also killed.

The Officials' Report. New York, April 20 .- The Erie officials here report that only three were killed in the Redhouse wreck, two women and a child. Five cars were totally wrecked

Later-Seven Killed. Dunkirk, April 20 .- A complete ac count of the casualties of the Redhouse wreck shows that seven were killed and 12 seriously injured. Of these, five of the dead were so badly burned that it was impossible to identify them. The flames of the wreck were put out by the Salamonca fire company, which was sent on a special train
